FIFTY- SEVENTH CONVOCATION

11 May, 2015

It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all on the occasion of the Fifty-seventh Convocation of the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai. The Institute has completed 59 years of its glorious existence and I am happy to report the activities of the International Institute for Population Sciences, for the academic year 2014-2015.

The Institute attained Deemed University status in 1985. As a Deemed University, the Institute started awarding its own Ph. D. degree since 1986. So far the Institute has awarded Ph.D. degrees to 247 students including 11 foreign students. This year 11 students are receiving their Ph.D. degrees. From the academic year 1988-89, the Institute started a one-year degree course leading to the Master of Population Studies (MPS) and so far the Institute has awarded the MPS degree to 542 students. Since 1994-95, the MPS course has also been introduced through distance learning, keeping in view the increasing demand for training in the field of Population Studies. So far, 335 students have been awarded MPS degree through learning. From the academic year 2001-2002, the Institute has started a degree course in Master of Philosophy (M. Phil.) in Population Studies. So far 322 students have been awarded the M. Phil. degree in Population Studies.

The Institute, since its inception in 1956, was conducting a one-year certificate programme, Certificate in Population Studies (CPS), for trainees from various countries in Asia and the Pacific

region. The course was funded initially by the UNESCAP and later on by the UNFPA. Over the years, through this course the Institute has helped in the training of personnel from various countries of Asia and the Pacific region, and our alumni currently occupy key positions in the field of population, health and development in government departments and universities in these countries and in international organisations. From the academic year 1991-92 this programme was re-designated as Diploma in Population Studies (DPS). So far 1204 students from 42 countries around the world have received CPS/DPS certificate/diploma from this Institute. Two tables given in Appendix I furnish country-wise and year-wise number of students who have so far participated in the different teaching programmes of the Institute. From the academic year 2006-07, the Institute has extended Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) programme through distance learning.

The one-year Diploma course in Health Education (DHE), started in August 1987 was renamed during the academic year 2001-2002 as Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE). So far 533 students have been awarded Diploma in Health Promotion Education, including 28 foreign students. In this convocation 18 students will be receiving their diploma in DHPE. From the academic year 2006-07, the Institute has initiated a new programme, Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH). This course is of fifteen months duration. The courses, viz., DHPE and PGDCH are conducted by the Family Welfare Training and

Research Centre (FWTRC), Mumbai which is affiliated to this Institute. From the academic year 2009-2010, the Institute has introduced a new programme, MA / M.Sc. in Population Studies (2 years course) and in the academic year 2013-2014, the institute has introduced another master degree, viz. M.Sc. in Biostatistics & Epidemiology.

ACTIVITIES OF THE INSTITUTE DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2014-2015

The functions of the IIPS can be classified under four categories: teaching, research, consultative services and documentation. The institute has seven academic departments with well qualified faculty members (vide Appendix X).

TEACHINGPROGRAMME

I. REGULAR COURSES

During the year 2014-15, the Institute offered the following regular courses: (a) Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE), (b) Master of Arts / Science in Population Studies (M.A/M.Sc.), (c) Master of Science in Biostatistics and Epidemiology (M.Sc), (d) Master of Population Studies (MPS), (e) Master of Philosophy in Population Studies (M.Phil.), and (f) Doctor of Philosophy in Population Studies (Ph.D.). Apart from these programmes, the Institute also offers Master of Population Studies (MPS) and Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) through distance learning.

The lists of students who are receiving degrees/ diplomas in this convocation are given in Appendix - II.

a. Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE)

This course is of one-year duration. During the current academic year, 18 students were on the roll in the course of Diploma in Health Promotion Education. The Family Welfare Training and Research Centre (FWTRC), Mumbai, conducts the course under the auspices of IIPS. The list of students receiving DHPE for this academic year is given in Appendix II - 1.

Dr. Sumita Ghosh is the coordinator for the DHPE programme.

b. Post - Graduate Diploma in Community Health Care (PGDCHC)

This course is of 15 months duration. In this convocation three students who have successfully completed the course in the current academic year will receive their degree. The list of students receiving PGDCHC for this academic year is given in Appendix II – 2.

c. Master of Arts/Science (M.A/M.Sc.) in Population Studies

The Institute has introduced M.A/M.Sc. in Population Studies from the academic year 2009-10 for graduate students who desire to specialize in population studies. This academic year 32 students have been admitted for this two year programme, with Government of India fellowship. The list of students receiving M.A/M.Sc degree for this academic year is given in Appendix II – 3. Appendix III – Table A provides list of students with the titles of their dissertations prepared as part of this course.

Dr. S. K. Mohanty and Dr. Manas R. Pradhan are the coordinators for the M.A/M.Sc. programme.

d. Master of Science (M.Sc) in Biostatistics and Epidemiology

In the academic year 2013-14, the Institute introduced a two-year degree course, viz. Master of Science (M.Sc) in Biostatistics and Epidemiology. Seven students have successfully completed the course this academic year and qualified to get degree in this convocation. The list of students receiving the M.A/M.Sc degree for this academic year is given in Appendix II – 4, and in Appendix III – Table B is given the list of students with the titles of their dissertations prepared as part of this course.

Dr. Abhishek Singh, Dr. L.K. Dwivedi and Dr Sarang Pedgaonkar are the coordinators for this M.Sc programme.

e. Master of Population Studies (MPS)

Holders of a Master"s Degree from recognized universities in relevant social science subjects including statistics and mathematics are eligible for admission to this course. During the current academic year, 37 students were admitted to MPS programme. All are recipients of Government of India fellowship. The list of students receiving the MPS degree for this academic year is given in Appendix II – 5. Appendix III – Table C provides list of students with the titles of their Term Papers prepared as part of this course.

Dr. P. K. Murthy and Dr. Dhananjay Bansod are the coordinators for the MPS programme.

f. Master of Philosophy (M. Phil) in Population Studies

The fourth batch of one year M. Phil programme will pass out this year. Thirty-five students will be receiving M. Phil degree this year. The list of students receiving degrees in this convocation is presented in Appendix II - 6. Appendix III – Table D provides list of students with the titles of their dissertations prepared as part of this course.

Dr. T.V. Sekher and Dr. Dipti Govil are the coordinators of M. Phil Programme.

g. Doctor of Philosophy in Population Studies (Ph. D)

The Institute has well qualified faculty members to guide students who are admitted to the Ph. D. programme on a highly competitive basis. Students admitted to the programme are selected based on their previous academic records, a written test on research methodology, and personal interview.

Currently 158 students are registered for the Ph. D programme at the Institute at different levels. Forty-five students are recipients of the Government of India Research Fellowship, 80 students recipient of the UGC Fellowship, 2 students recipient of Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship, 2 students recipient of Maulana Azad National Fellowship, and 9 students are registered without fellowship (vide Appendix IV - Table B). This academic year, 11 students have completed all the requirements for the award of Ph. D degree.

Appendix II - 7 provides list of Ph.D. students who will be receiving degree in this convocation. In

Appendix III – Table E is given the titles of their theses submitted for the award of the degree.

Prof. P. Arokiasamy is the coordinator for the Ph. D. programme.

II. DISTANCE LEARNING COURSES

In addition to the above regular courses, IIPS delivers some of its courses through distance learning method. We are happy to inform that our institute has been recognized by the Distance Education Council for offering MPS and DPS through distance learning.

h. Master of Population Studies (MPS) (Distance Learning)

This course is of two years duration, although students have the flexibility of completing it in a maximum period of four years. In view of the increasing demand, the MPS Distance Learning Programme is also open to students from other ESCAP countries. Currently 566 students are enrolled for this programme. During the year 2014-15, seventeen students have completed all the requirements for the award of MPS degree (Distance Learning). It is mandatory for the students of Distance Learning to prepare a research (term) paper. Appendix II - 8 provides list of students who will be receiving their degrees in this convocation. Appendix III - Table F provides the titles of the Term Papers submitted by the students as part of the course.

Prof. Balram Paswan is the coordinator for the MPS (Distance learning) programme.

i. Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) (Distance Learning)

In view of the increasing demand, DPS (DE) has

been initiated from the academic year 2006-07. This course is of minimum one year duration, although students have the flexibility of completing it in a maximum period of three years. Currently 143 students, including three foreign students, are enrolled for this programme. This academic year, 6 students have completed all requirements for the award of DPS (Distance learning). Appendix II - 9 provides list of students who will be receiving the degree in this convocation. Appendix III - Table G provides the titles of the Term Papers submitted as part of the course.

Prof. Balram Paswan is the coordinator for the DPS (Distance Learning) programme.

SEMINAR PAPERS

Towards the end of the course, as a part of DPS, M.A/M.Sc, MPS, M.Phil courses, each student is required to prepare a research paper (for DPS/ MPS programme) or a dissertation (for M.A/M.Sc, M.Phil programmes) under the guidance of a faculty member. The students have to present the paper in a specially organised "Student-Faculty Seminar". It is mandatory for all the students to attend the student-faculty seminar. The presented papers /dissertations are evaluated on the basis of presentations/discussions in the seminars. The seminar paper/dissertation constitutes a crucial part of the teaching programme, as it contributes significantly to the development of the research potential of the students. Appendix III (Tables A, B, C, D, E, & F) provides list of seminar papers/ dissertations presented by the students during the current academic year (2014-15).

AWARDS/MEDALS

A student from MPS programme, whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best, is awarded the Dr. C. Chandrasekaran Gold Medal.

A student each from DHPE and PGDCH programmes, whose overall performance adjudged to be the best, are awarded the IIPS Gold Medal.

A student, whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in the MPS (Distance Learning) programme, is awarded the Dr. K. Srinivasan Gold Medal.

A student, whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in the DPS (Distance Learning) programme is awarded the IIPS Gold Medal.

A student whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in the M. Phil programme is awarded IIPS gold medal.

A student whose M. Phil/Ph.D thesis, adjudged to be the best, is awarded the Dr. P.N. Mari Bhat Gold Medal. This award has been instituted in memory of Prof. P.N. Mari Bhat by his parents.

A student whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in the M.A/M.Sc. programme is awarded the Prof. Asha A. Bhende Gold Medal. This medal has been instituted in memory of Prof. Asha A. Bhende by the Institute of Health Management (IHMP), Pachod (Aurangabad).

A student from MPS programme, whose seminar paper is rated as the best, is awarded the Dr. J.R. Rele award. This award is based on the Seminar

Paper's content, presentation and defence skill of the student while presenting the paper at the 'IIPS Student – Faculty Seminar'.

Silver medals (IIPS) are awarded to students whose overall performance is ranked as the second best, in the respective programmes – M.A/M.Sc., MPS, M.Phil, DHPE, PGDCH, DPS (Distance Learning) and MPS (Distance Learning).

SHORT - TERM PROGRAMMES

In addition to the above, the Institute conducts short-term training courses on request. The Coordinator(s) of Short Term Training Programme also takes care of the visitors from various academic and research organization, who regularly visit IIPS as the part of their academic curriculum.

The Institute conducted a short term course on Demographic Techniques to ISS probationers, and officials of RGI from Maharashtra and Gujarat in this academic year.

IIPS- Kusuma Foundation Research Fellowship Project

International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai, in partnership with The Kusuma Trust (UK) and The Kusuma Foundation (India) launched a three year research fellowship programme to promote research in education in India. The main objective of the programme is to train and impart research skills to young professionals and faculty working in NGOs and colleges who have the potential, but not the opportunity, to conduct research on education issues of national importance and relevance to

Kusuma"s strategic priorities. The fellowship should also enable the fellows to disseminate their findings at national and international forums. The research fellowship will provide selected candidates with high-level research skills, including knowledge of statistics, qualitative research and data analysis.

The fourth training workshop of IIPS-Kusuma Foundation related to research methodology entitled "*Principles of Scientific Writing and Communication*" was successfully completed during 21-25 July, 2014.

1. WORLD POPULATION DAY

4. Dr. P.N. MARI BHAT MEMORIAL LECTURE

The seventh Professor P.N. Mari Bhat Memorial Lecture was held on 27th April, 2015. Dr. David Bloom, currently Clarence James Gamble Professor of Economics and Demography at the Harvard T. H. Chan School of Public Health and Director of Harvard's NIA-funded Program on the Global Demography of Aging delivered, delivered lecture on "India's Prospects for Economic Growth, As Viewed through a Demographic and Health Lens" on the occasion. Prof. F. Ram, Director, IIPS, chaired the session.

5. NATIONAL SEMINAR

National Seminar on Population, Health and Inclusive Development was organized bγ International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) Mumbai, in collaboration with Indian Institute of Public Health, Gandhinagar (IIPHG), during 25-27 February, 2015. The seminar focussed on the interrelationship between population, health and inclusive development in India (with special reference to Gujarat). Around 100 papers were presented, including two plenary sessions, 14 oral and two poster sessions. First plenary session was "Population and Health: Public Private Partnership" and the second plenary was on "Missing Girl Child in India: Causes Consequences". The participants were researchers.

6. INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR

The International Seminar on "Assisted Reproductive Technologies in Northern and Southern Countries: issues, challenges and the future" was held at IIPS during 30-31 October, 2014. This seminar was co-organised by the Institut National d"Etudes Démographiques (INED, Paris, France), the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS, Mumbai, India), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA, India) and the Centre de Population et de Développement (CEPED, Paris, France).

In the inaugural session Ms Frederika Meijer,

UNFPA Representative of India, presented UNFPA's commitment and work on ART; Jean-Raphaël Peytregnet, French General Consul, and Sandrine Maximilien, Attachée for Science and Technology at the French Embassy in India, presented the French scientific collaboration and particularly the Indo-French Centre for the Promotion of Advance Research (IFCPAR). Prof F. Ram, Director and Senior Professor at IIPS chaired the inaugural session.



During the two-day seminar five sessions were organised and 18 presentations were made by senior researchers from nine countries. Participants of this seminar were ART experts, including a Director of an infertility clinic, a delegate from Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), a Director of a surrogacy agency and a delegate of an Indian women's group. These exciting presentations represented different disciplines (anthropology, medicine, law, sociology, public health, demography) and dealt with nine different countries and regions.

XI. LIBRARY

The International Institute for Population Sciences library has a collection of resources taking into

consideration the course contents and research needs of the Institute. It holds about 83,156 books, 15,959 bound volumes of periodicals, 16,767 Reprints and 600 audio-visual materials and subscribes to over 300 journals, more than 75 journals received in the library by the way of gift and exchange. More than 25,500 research articles from the core journals and edited books have been indexed and made available through OPAC. The library has the collection on population studies and relevant subjects like, religion, psychology, sociology. statistics. economics. public administration, education. mathematics. anthropology, public health, history, geography, etc. The library provides a host of information services to its users, like Current Awareness, New Additions, Selective Dissemination of Information, Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), Document Delivery Service, Photocopy facilities, Reference Service, Bibliographic service, metadata interpolation and so on.

The library has a special collection of all the census volumes of published in pre-independence period (Census of India 1872 to 1941 in PDF format) till the latest Census 2011. The library provides access to the several online databases like JSTOR, SCIENCEDIRECT (social science collection), SCOPUS, INDIASTAT and other leading publisher"s online collection relevant to health and population sciences.

The IIPS library has institutional membership with INFLIBNET (UGC), DELNET and exploring maximum services for the benefit of the Institute.

The library has reading hall equipped with comfortable furniture, air-condition and wi fi facility. The library working hours has extended up to 8.00 p.m. The library is accessible through www.iipsindia.org for all.

Future plan: It is proposed to develop the institute repository including entire reprint collection in digital form in the near future.

Mr. D.D. Mestri is in-charge of the library (LIO).

XII. INFORMATION, COMMUNICATION AND TECHNOLOGY UNIT

The ICT Unit of the institute, that was till recently known as the Computer and Data Centre, is well equipped with the IBM Blade Center server, latest Core i3 and higher generation computers and statistical software required for data analysis. There are a total 260 desktop computers in the Institute. The Unit has one main classroom/lab room with 48 computers with three LCD projectors, another small classroom/lab with capacity of 16 computers. Computer classes for MPS, M.A/M.Sc, M.Sc. in Biostatistics & Epidemiology, M. Phil and Short term courses are held in these labs. All the computers are configured with 1Gbps Bandwidth Capacity link for internet access and connected by Local Area Network and WiFi connectivity. The ICT Unit is also providing the internal email facility to faculty and staff at the institute. Wireless internet facilities have been established and made available to the students in the hostels and library. Internet and computer facility to students and faculty on campus are provided 24X7 by ICT Unit.

The software packages installed are SAS Version

9.4, IBM SPSS Version 20, STATA Version 13, GIS Version 10. ML Win. Atlas Ti. Spectrum. Mortpak. and Endnote. The ICT Unit has network attached unified storage server with 10TB capacity that stores demographic and census data. The data sets of Census of India (1991, 2001, 2011), National Family Health Survey (I, II, III), District Level Household and facility Survey (I, II, III), Demographic Health Survey (DHS) of selected countries, National Sample Survey (NSS), Global Adult Tobacco Survey (GATS), Youth Study, Longitudinal Aging Study in India (LASI) and Study on Global Aging and Adult Health (SAGE) are available to researchers at the Institute. On request, datasets are also being provided to Indian and International researchers from outside.

ICT unit is maintaining IIPS website. The unit is in the process of making website bilingual (English & Hindi). A web based application for distribution of dataset has been developed for making available IIPS surveyed datasets online after a simple registration process.

Steps have been initiated to start eGovernance in the Institute to cover the functioning of the various departments of the institute including Accounts and Administration.

1. NVIVO Seminar:

The NVIVO Seminar on "Qualitative Data Analysis with NVivo" has been hold at ICT unit LAB IIPS in Mumbai, on 13 March 2015. The seminar aims to know about use of NVIVO for Qualitative Data Analysis for example how this package will be helpful in organize and analyze interviews, field notes, textual sources, and other types of

qualitative data including image, audio and video files etc. The seminar presenter was Professor Dr. Suria Baba - Director Education and Learning Centre Universiti Malaysia, Kelan-tan. A total of approx 40 students from M.Phil. & Ph.D. courses and 10 faculty of and 12 external participants, participated in the Seminar.

2. SAS training workshop:

Six day"s training workshop of "SAS Programming fast was track" successfully completed during 22-27 September, Objectives of this training workshop were to gain knowledge about processing of the language of SAS software and understanding of the SAS programming syntax. Total ten faculty from IIPS were attended the training workshop. All the technical assistants/arrangement for the training programme was done by the ICT unit, IIPS.

IIPS has a well established publication unit. Periodically IIPS publishes Newsletters, Research Briefs and Working papers.

a. IIPS Newsletter

The Institute brings out Newsletters, which publish information about various ongoing activities of the Institute. Two issues of IIPS Newsletters covering four numbers were printed during the academic year, 2014-15.

Prof. H. Lhungdim and Dr. Harihar Sahoo are the Editors of IIPS Newsletter.

b. IIPS Research Brief Series

The "Research Brief Series" is a new initiative of the Institute started in 2007, to provide an opportunity to the faculty, Ph.D. students and visiting fellows to quickly disseminate the important findings of their research studies before they are published as a research report or in a scientific journal. So for 14 research briefs were published under this series.

Prof. H. Lhungdim and Dr. Harihar Sahoo are the Editors of IIPS Research Brief Series.

IIPS Working Paper Series

The 'Working Paper Series' is a new initiative started during 2009-10. Its main objective is to disseminate new research ideas, theoretical development and methodological insights initiated by IIPS to the national and international community as quickly as possible. The papers published under

this series are peer-reviewed by two external experts working in the areas of Population, Health and Development. So far, 8 working papers were published.

Prof. H. Lhungdim and Dr. Harihar Sahoo are the Editors of IIPS working paper series.

XIV. DEMOGRAPHY INDIA JOURNAL

The professional Journal of Indian Association for the Study of Population (IASP) is presently managed at IIPS. Prof. F. Ram is the Chief Editor of the Journal since 2011. This long standing journal publishes peer-reviewed articles and book reviews, focusing on demographic and health issues and more specifically on Indian demography. The two issues brought out each year contain about 25 articles, book reviews and presidential address of IASP conferences and Dr. George Simmons memorial lectures. The journal is subscribed by the universities and research centers both in India and abroad, apart from the members of IASP.

Dr. T. V. Sekher is the Managing Editor of the Journal.

XV. PLACEMENT CELL

In order to help the graduating students to find suitable job opportunities, a Placement Cell was established at the Institute in 2010. This Cell contacts various organizations / institutes working in the field of population, health and related areas and conveys the CVs and information about the passing out students.

The Cell also facilitates conducting the campus interviews for organizations interested in recruiting from IIPS. This provides a unique opportunity for the employers and students to interact each other for the benefit of both.

XVI. HOSTEL FACILITY

The teaching and training programme at the Institute are fully residential. The Institute has two hostels. All the rooms are self contained, well furnished and having adequate living and working space.
