A. Symposium

Symposium on the International Day of Older Persons- 2022

Centre for Ageing Studies of IIPS organized a symposium on the International Day for Older Persons on 3rd October 2022. The theme for this year was *"Resilience of Older Persons in a Changing World"*.



The speakers in the symposium were Mr. Mathew Cherian, (Board Chair, CARE India and former CEO, HelpAge India), Dr. Sundeep Salvi, (Director, Pulmocare Research and Education (PURE) Foundation, Pune) and Prof. Asha Banu Soletti, (Dean, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai). Prof. K.S. James, Director & Sr.



Professor, IIPS, chaired the symposium and talked about the relevance of the theme and Prof. T.V. Sekher, Head, Centre for Ageing Studies, welcomed everyone to the symposium and introduced the guest speakers. Mr. Mathew Cherian in his speech talked about the interventions undertaken by the Government and

Supreme court for the elderly. According to him, the most important and critical intervention in old



age is good health followed by children to look after the elderly. As Helpage International Ambassador on ageing, Mr. Cherian shared his many experiences in dealing with ageing issues. Dr. Sundeep Salvi discussed on ageing and health problems. Dr. Salvi said there are various biological mechanisms that have been responsible to the ageing process. Further he talked about the determinants of healthy ageing such as cognitive training, exercise, diet, spiritual life and counselling. Prof. Asha Banu Soletti focused her talk on mental health and its implication for elderly. Along with healthcare, it is also important to understand how families are equipped and prepared to take care of senior citizens. Prof. Banu further talked about the



factors influencing mental health of older persons in individual as well as community level. The

presentations were followed by question-answer session. The symposium ended with a formal vote of thanks by Prof. R. Nagarajan, Associate Head, Centre for Ageing Studies. Nearly 200 persons (faculty, students and researchers and

World Population Day Symposium and India Launch of United Nations World Population Prospects – 2022

On the occasion of World Population Day, the Publications Cell of IIPS organized the World Population Day-2022 Symposium and the India launch of the United Nations World Population Prospects-2022. Prof. Vegard Skirbekk, Professor, Columbia Aging Center, Columbia



University, Prof. U. S. Mishra, Professor, Department of Bio-Statistics and Epidemiology, IIPS and Dr. Rajeshwari Chandrasekar, Head,



UNICEF, Maharashtra were the eminent speakers for the Symposium. Prof. K. S. James,

Director IIPS, chaired the session and Prof. T. V. Sekher, Coordinator, welcomed the gathering and introduced the program.

Prof. Vegard Skirbekk, made his presentation on "Social and biological drivers of low fertility". He said that the social factors are the primary drivers of low and late fertility. Lower mortality, education, higher costs of childbearing, skill biased technological change, the changing role of women and alternative time use have contributed to changes in reproductive behavior. He also pointed out that most likely future events (pandemics, economic downturns, environmental catastrophes, technological breakthroughs offsetting labour) may depress the fertility further. As part of the World Population Day celebrations,



the United Nations World Population Prospects 2022 was launched in India and the recorded speech of Dr. John Wilmoth, Director, UN Population Division, was played. He talked about



the six key messages from the world population prospects-2022. It was followed by Prof. U S Mishra's comments on the major findings of world population prospects-2022. He talked about the imbalance in population distribution trends and the population stabilization. He concluded by



saying population prospects is quite important in formulating indicators. Dr. Rajeshwari Chandrasekar in her speech, reminded the audience that despite all the challenges, the world population day offers a moment to celebrate human progress. We have advanced in health with extended life spans, reduced maternal mortality and child mortality. Technological innovations have eased our lives and has connected us more than ever. The symposium was followed by the declaration of winners of the essay writing completion, organized as part of the

world population day. Students from various colleges and universities in Mumbai city participated in the Essay writing competition. The cash prizes and certificates were distributed to the winners.

The Short-Term Training Program Cell of IIPS organized a guest lecture on 23rd January 2023 by **Prof. Abhiroop Mukhopadhyay**, Professor, Indian Statistical Institute (Delhi). The lecture was on the topic - "Empirical Analysis: A Primer". The lecture mainly answered questions like "Does Access to Modern Contraception lead to worsening sex ratios?" and How do we identify such "causal" relations? The lecture briefly introduced to use of multivariate regression models to problems of causal inference. It explored the concept of what an "experiment" means for social scientists and how to interpret regressions as the first step to experimental design. The lecture also introduced students to

the idea behind two popular experimental Designs-Difference in Difference (DID) and Panel Data identification. The lecture was attended by 52 PhD scholars and Master students. Prof. T. V. Sekher, Co-ordinator, STTP, introduced the speaker and coordinated the program.



D. Workshops

Hands-on Workshop on "Use of Gridded Population Data"

The GENDER Project of IIPS along with INED, France organized a two-day hands-on workshop on 'Use of Gridded Population Data' at IIPS during September 6-7, 2022. The training programme was attended by 40 young faculty members and PhD students. The instructors for the workshop were Dr. Ankit Sikarwar and Dr. Valerie Golaz (both from INED, France). The Coordinators of the GENDER project are Prof.

Workshop on "Harmonization of Ageing Data around the World"

The Centre for Ageing Studies and Short-Term Training Programme (STTP) Cell of the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) jointly organized a one-day workshop on "Harmonization of Ageing Data around the World" on 07th November, 2022 at ICT centre, IIPS. 48

participants from various universities/research institutes attended the workshop. The resource persons were Prof. Jinkook Lee, Director, Program on Global Ageing, Health, and Policy, University of Southern California, Ms. Sandy Chien, Director of Data Management, University

of Southern California and Ms. Sarah Petrosyan, Programmer, University of Southern California.



The Gateway to Global Aging Data (<https://g2aging.org>) is a platform for population survey data on ageing around the globe. The Gateway has done harmonization of LASI, HRS, MHAS, ELSA, SHARE, CHARLS, KLoSA, JSTAR, TILDA, MARS and CRELES datasets, with which researchers can undertake comparable studies across countries. The workshop was organized to enhance the researchers' capability to utilize the harmonized HRS-family datasets by providing them hands on training. The workshop discussed on the Health and Retirement Studies (HRS) across 41 countries and also covered the Harmonized Cognitive Assessment Protocol (HCAP). The

afternoon session was on the introduction to the gateway to global ageing data which was followed by practical classes. Prof. K. S. James, Director, IIPS, inaugurated the workshop. Prof. T. V. Sekher, Head, Centre for Ageing Studies, IIPS outlined the workshop programme and introduced the resource persons. Prof. Jinkook Lee spoke about the increasing need for comparative research and the importance of cross-country data sets to understand many dimensions and implications for population ageing. Workshop on “Health Programmes and Impact Evaluation Methods”

Indian Health Economics and Policy Association (IHEPA) and International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) jointly organized a workshop on “Health Programmes and Impact Evaluation Methods” from March 20-24, 2023 at IIPS. 29 participants mostly PhD scholars and young faculty members from various universities attended the workshop. The workshop provided a rigorous overview of the tools and techniques to evaluate the causal effect of health policies and programmes. The tools and techniques included randomised control experiments and quasi-experiments such as difference-in-difference, regression discontinuity, propensity score matching and instrumental variables. The participants got an exposure on how to design and conduct an evaluation study, how to interpret evaluation results, read evaluation research carefully and understand the advantages and limitations of each method.



Workshop on "Introduction to Python programming"

Department of Survey Research and Data Analytics had successfully conducted a five days hands-on training workshop on "Introduction to Python programming" held during 1-5 March 2023 at ICT lab, IIPS, Mumbai. This training workshop was the first offline workshop in the series of upcoming workshops of the department. The workshop was designed to give participants

The workshop covered various topics starting from a brief overview of the Python interpreter, vector, list, dictionaries, tuples, string manipulation, file handling, function module, regular expression, numpy and panda's

library and data visualization using matplotlib library. A total of 29 participants which includes master's students, research scholars, and working professionals from different universities and organizations across the country attended and successfully completed the workshop.

Dr. Angel M. Foster is a Professor in the Faculty of Health Sciences at the University of Ottawa. She holds a doctorate from the University of Oxford in Middle Eastern Studies, an MD from Harvard Medical School, and both master's and bachelor's degrees from Stanford University. Dr. Foster is a global abortion researcher and leads projects in 22 countries in Asia, Africa, Europe, the Middle East, and North America. She has authored more than 100 articles and co-edited three books; she also led the most recent revision of the Inter-Agency Field Manual on Reproductive Health in Humanitarian Settings. Dr. Foster serves as the Chair of the Board of Directors of the National Abortion Federation, Canada, the Co-Chair of the Safe Abortion Care Sub-Working Group of the Inter-Agency Working Group on Reproductive Health in Crises (IAWG) and the Editor-in-Chief of Perspectives on Sexual and Reproductive Health. The recipient of numerous awards in honours, she received the Guttmacher Institute's 2017 Darroch Award for Excellence in Sexual and Reproductive Health Research and the Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality's 2018 Public Service Award.

Professor Asha A. Bhende (1928-2010) was an accomplished academician and a prolific writer. Her book "Principles of Population Studies" co-authored with the late Prof Tara Kanitkar of IIPS has had 20 editions over the years. She served as an advisor to several organizations such as UGC, NACO, TISS, and Family Planning Training and Research Center and was a Visiting Fellow at the Population Institute, Australian National University, Canberra and the East West Center, Hawaii. Prof. Bhende worked as a consultant to many international and national organizations including ILO, UNFPA, Rockefeller Foundation, World Vision, National Association for the Blind, and Organization for Educational Resources and Technical Training. She was a Board member of the Foundation for Research in Health Systems and National Association for the Blind, and a Chairperson of the Ashish Gram Rachana Trust, Indian Institute of Health Management, Pachod, Maharashtra. Her book on her life, titled "*Majhya Jagaat Mi*" (In my own world, am I) was published. Prof. Asha A. Bhende was also a highly accomplished actress, with training in music and dance. Prof. Bhende was a unique combination of artistic talent and academic brilliance, who is remembered with respect and affection.

About IIPS

The International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), formerly known as Demographic Training and Research Centre, was established at Mumbai in July 1956 under the joint sponsorship of Sir Dorabji Tata Trust, the Government of India and the United Nations to serve as the regional centre for training and research in Population Studies for the countries of Asia and Pacific region. The Vision of the Institute is to position IIPS as a premier teaching and research institution in population sciences responsive to emerging national and global needs based on values of inclusion, sensitivity and rights protection. The Mission of the Institute is to strive to be a centre of excellence on all population and relevant issues through high quality education, teaching and research. This is achieved by creating competent professionals, generating and disseminating scientific knowledge and evidence, collaborating and exchanging knowledge, and advocacy and awareness. The Institute was redesignated to its present name in March 1984 to facilitate expansion of its academic activities. It was declared as a 'Deemed University' on August 14, 1985, under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956 by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India in view of its contribution to the field of population studies. The recognition has enabled it to formulate its own courses as well as award degrees. This has paved the way for its further expansion as an academic institution. Currently, the IIPS is an autonomous institution under the administrative control of Department of Family Welfare, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India. It holds a unique position among all the regional population centres started by the United Nations. It was the first such centre which was started, and it serves a much larger population than any of the regional centres.

This is the only Institute of its kind in the world completely devoted to teaching and research in the population-related areas. Naturally it attracts students from other countries which lack such facilities. This year, the Institute is completing 65 years of its glorious existence in the field of Population Sciences. Since its inception in 2015, International Yoga Day (IYD) is conducted every year by Staff welfare committee, IIPS.

Why this International Yoga Day -2022...

Since its inception in 2015, International Yoga Day (IYD) is conducted every year by IIPS, which has been attended and graced by Central Ministers of Government of India. Yoga is known to promote psychophysical health. Yoga will reduce the stress, will facilitate recovery from COVID-19 and yoga will promote all aspects of health. Practice of yoga will promote immunity and prevent the infections including COVID.

This National yoga day is mainly on how to improve the mental, physical & psychological health. Hence the topic of the day is "Yoga for Perfect Health". The sessions will be presented by the experienced faculty members who have the expertise in their respective fields related to Yoga.




Brief Report:
