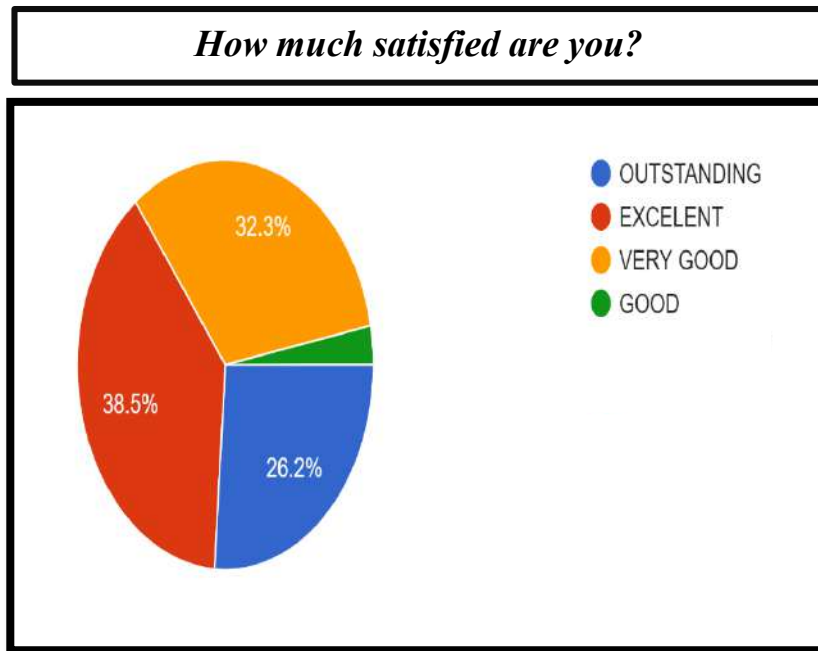
As per the current demand of the market, this workshop helped in sharpening one's skills using Excel spreadsheets and expanding their knowledge of the fundamentals of analyzing data.

The resources person started with the basic functioning of the excel sheet and gradually take into the advanced level of analysis using excel sheet.

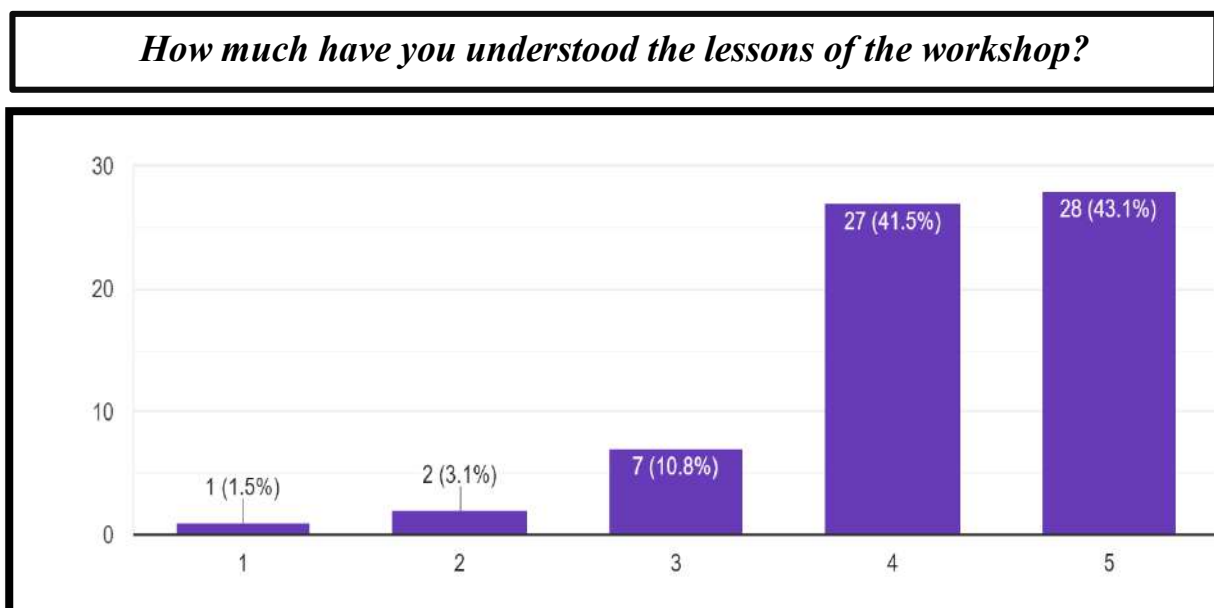

The total number students participated in the workshop was 97 and majority of the participants of the workshop found the workshop to be valuable. Around 26% of the participants gave the feedback as *outstanding* workshop. This was followed by *excellent* with 39% and *very good* with 32%.

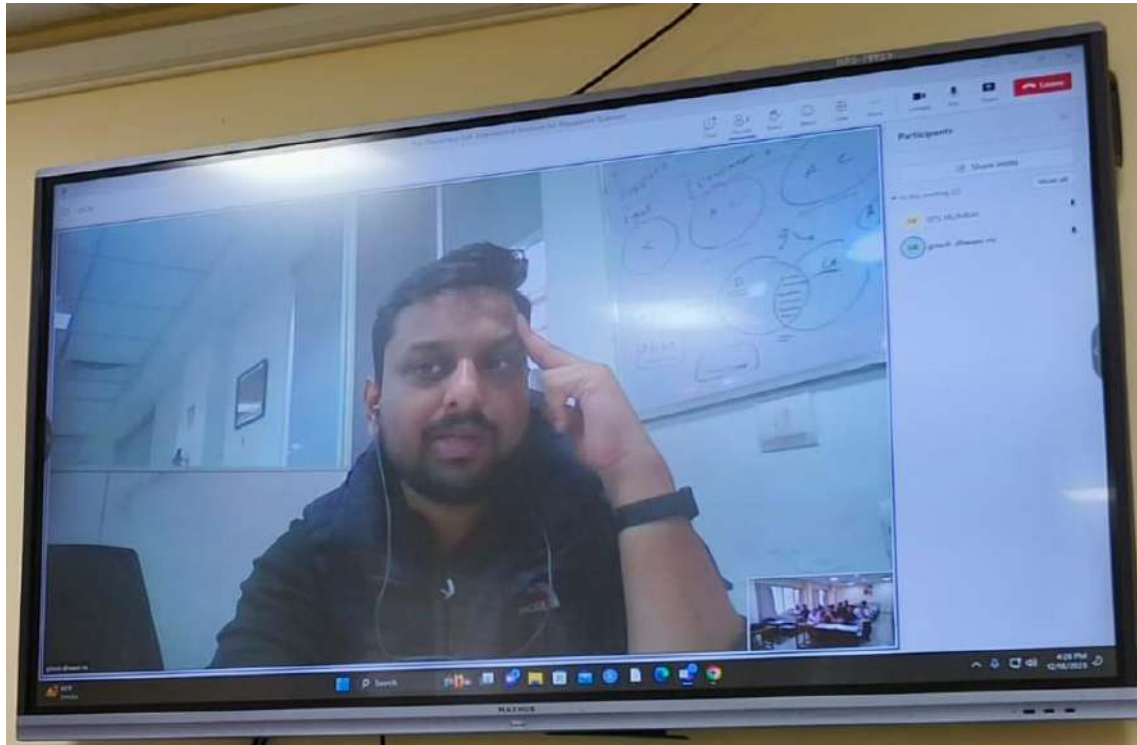

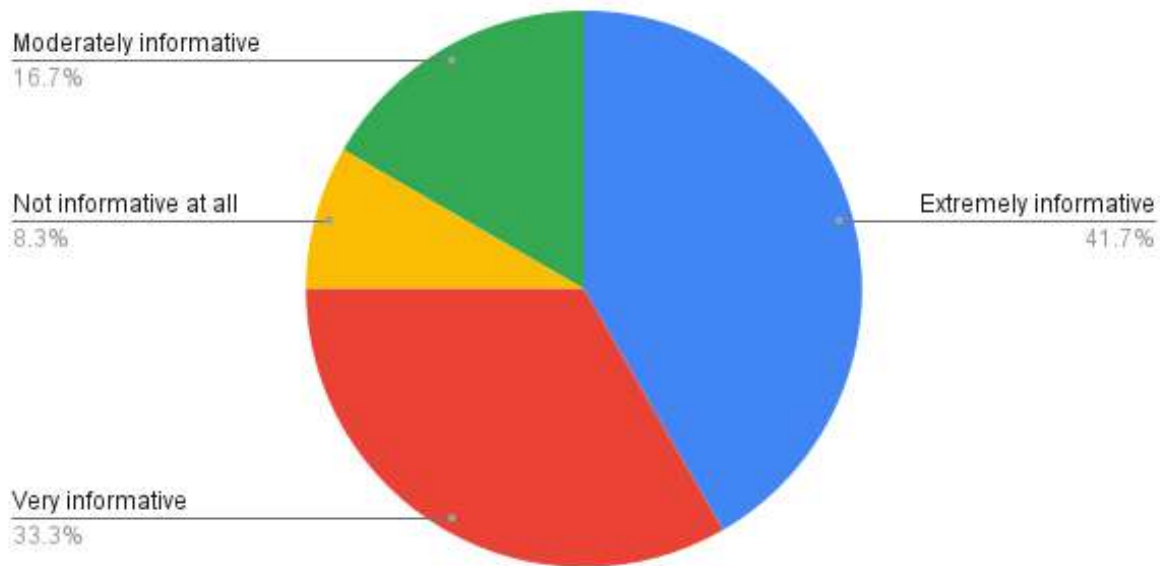

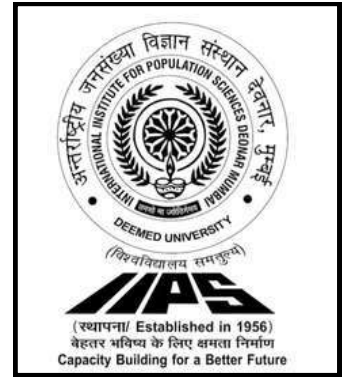

WISH primarily operates in public-private partnerships with state governments, international agencies, and the private sector

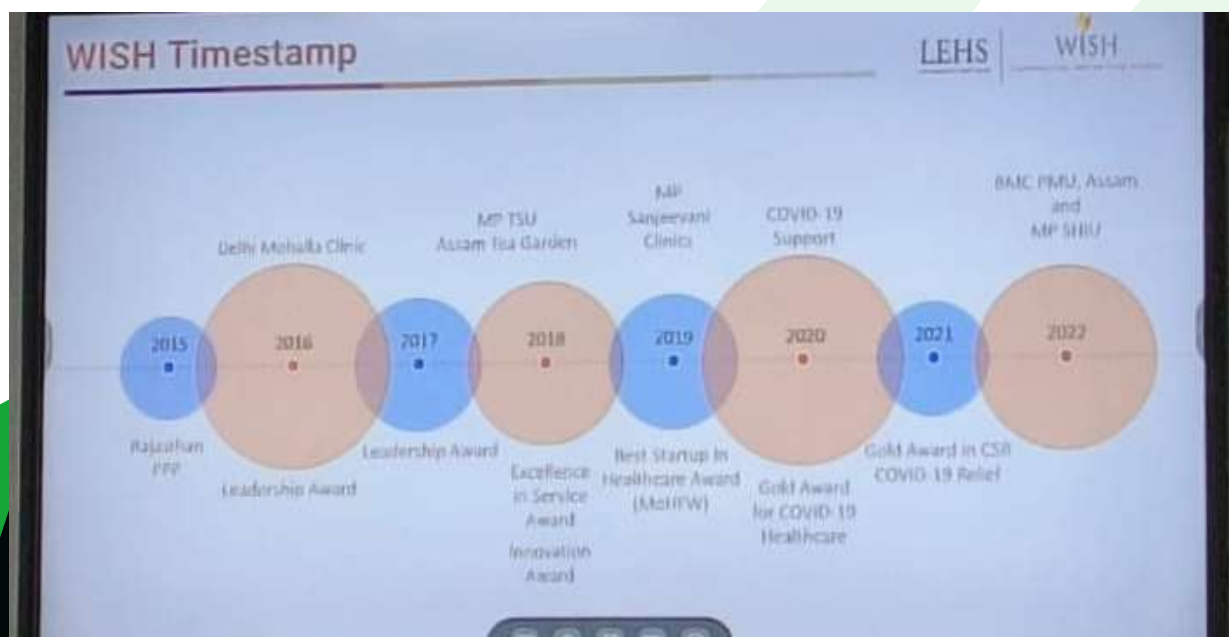

64th CONVOCATION OF IIPS

The sixty-fourth convocation of the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) was held on 6th May 2023. Prof. K. S. James, Director IIPS, presented the activities and achievements of the Institute for the year 2022-23. This year, 198 students were awarded degrees/diplomas. Additionally, the exceptional research and academic achievements of these students were duly recognized and lauded with the presentation of gold and silver medals.



Dr. Rajiv Bahl, Secretary to the Government of India, Department of Health Research & Director General, ICMR, presided over the function. Dr. Rajiv Bahl delivered the presidential address and expressed that it was a privilege to address the institute on behalf of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), Government of India. He commended the institute for its longstanding commitment to providing top-tier

education and its extensive contributions to nationwide health surveys and research over several decades. Dr. Bahl underscored the significance of high-quality data, specifically acknowledging the institute's dedication towards maintaining survey quality, with particular focus on the National Family Health Survey (NFHS). Furthermore, he engaged in a discussion regarding the relevance of the Longitudinal Aging Study in India (LASI), particularly in the context of its implications for the social, economic, and health-related well-being of the rapidly growing elderly population in the country.

The convocation address was delivered by Dr. Indu Bhushan, Ex-CEO, Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana and the National Health Authority, Government of India. During his address, Dr. Indu Bhushan highlighted the significant opportunities and challenges that arise from two pivotal landmarks for India. The first landmark pertains to India surpassing China to become the world's most populous nation, while the second landmark involves achieving below-replacement-level fertility. Dr. Bhushan also underscored the





importance of identifying and addressing the needs of vulnerable populations, alongside promoting gender equality.

In addition, he addressed the issue of data quality, emphasizing the necessity of enhancing data accuracy and relevance by incorporating technological innovations such as big data, artificial intelligence (AI), machine learning, and similar advancements.

WORLD POPULATION DAY SYMPOSIUM

The World Population Day 2023 marks a special significance with India becoming the most populous country in the world. On this occasion, an event was organized by IIPS wherein Dr. Soumya Swaminathan, Former Deputy Director General for Programmes and the first Chief Scientist of the World Health Organization (WHO) and also a renowned physician-scientist with a career spanning 30 years in clinical care, research, and policy, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest.



The event featured diverse activities including the screening of the Malthusian Clock Video for students. Additionally, there was an Interaction session with the Director, followed by the “Wall of Demographers” inauguration.

The event was introduced by Prof. U.S. Mishra, while Prof. K.S. James, the Director and Senior Professor at IIPS, shared the inaugural remarks. The program also included a video message from Distinguished Global Demographers, wherein they shared their perspective on "India being the most populous country: boon or bane". This was followed by an introduction of the Guest Speaker by Prof. U.S. Mishra, and an insightful address by Chief Guest, Dr. Soumya Swaminathan, where she shared her insights on the importance of World Population Day, particularly in the context of “Health Challenges in 21st Century”.

A significant highlight was the release of the book "India Population Report" by Dr. Soumya Swaminathan, followed by a concise summary of the book, presented by Professor T.V. Sekher.

This day also marked the re-opening of the new academic session of the Institute. Prof. Nagarajan, Examination Cell in charge of IIPS, formally announced the commemoration of the upcoming academic session at IIPS.

Dr. Soumya Swaminathan, felicitated the winners of the Essay Writing Competition, conducted as a part of the World Population Day 2023. The event was concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Srinivas Goli, co-ordinator of STTP and Publication Cell.

DR. B. R. AMBEDKAR MEMORIAL LECTURE



Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Memorial Lecture was held on 28 April 2023 at IIPS. Dr. Narendra Jadhav, Former Member of Parliament (MP), Rajya Sabha & Emeritus Professor of Public Policy, MIT School of Government, Pune, delivered a lecture on “Dr. Ambedkar:

a multi-faceted genius”. Prof. K. S. James, Director, International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) chaired the lecture. Prof. Chander Shekhar, Department of Fertility and Social Demography, IIPS, was the discussant for the lecture. A large number of participants, both from within the Institute and from outside, graced the event.

National Family Health Survey-6 (NFHS-6)

National Family Health Survey-6 (NFHS-6)- Main Survey ToT

As a part of the ongoing National Family Health Survey-6, IIPS conducted the Main Survey ToT from 31 March – 19 April, 2023 at Hotel Baywatch, Goa, for core team members of the various Field Agencies of Phase I

states/groups /UTs. During the training, questions included in the paper-pencil format were explained in detail after which CAPI questionnaires were introduced and hands-on training on mini laptops was provided.



A separate CAB training for Health Coordinators was held simultaneously. Guest lectures by experts in the field were organized on various topics like family planning, immunization, etc. Also, field practice in rural and urban PSUs was organized for a complete understanding of the entire data collection process and also testing of the procedures and CAPI

program. On the last day of training, a debriefing session was held where the participants from each FA shared their experiences and feedback in terms of conducting interviews, CAPI flow, assigning and synching of data, etc. During the debriefing session, PIs and officials from MoHFW were present and shared their valuable inputs during the deliberations. All changes that were finalized on the basis of the suggestions that came up during the debriefing were incorporated in the NFHS-6 tools. During the ToT, on 18 April, 2023 a TAC meeting under the Chairmanship of DG (Stats.), MoHFW was held to review the progress of NFHS-6 activities and the way forward.

National Family Health Survey-6 (NFHS-6)- Fourth Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting

Longitudinal Ageing Study in India (LASI), Wave 2 - TAC Meeting

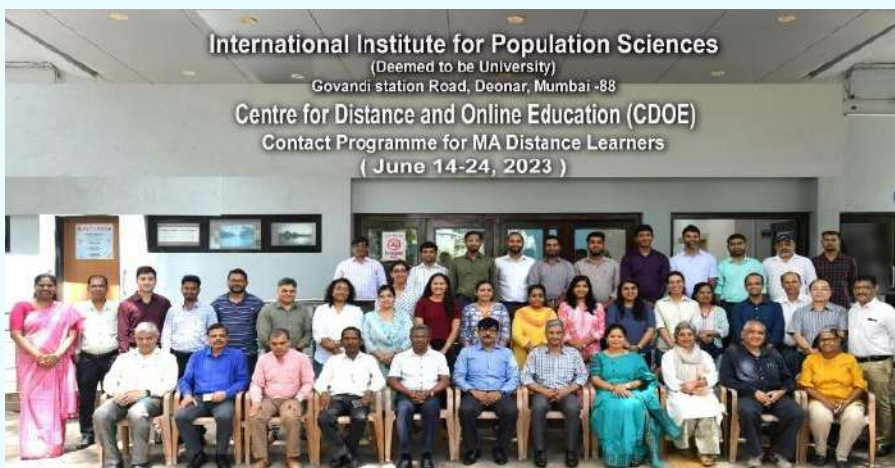
participation of students from IIPS, were able to conduct the first-ever conference on this scale since its inception in 2021.

Prof. S.K. Singh, Prof. L.K. Dwivedi, and Dr. Sarang Pedgaonkar are the coordinators in the IIPS-IFPRI-NITI Collaboration funded by NITI Aayog begun in June 2023, with a project duration of one year.

Prof. S.K. Singh, Dr. Sudipta M., and Prof. C. Legare are coordinating the "Young Wives; An Exploratory Study of Married Women Below Twenty and the Socio-cultural Determinants of Their Contraceptive Behavior in Low Resource Settings in India", funded by USAID. It commenced in July 2022 and has been planned for two years.

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The International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), formerly known as the Demographic Training and Research Centre (DTRC) till 1970, was established in 1956 under the joint sponsorship of Sir Dorabji Tata Trust, the Government of India, and the United Nations. The Institute is under the administrative control of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.

The Institute served as a regional centre for Training and Research in Population Studies for the ESCAP region. The Institute was re-designated to its present title in 1985 to facilitate the expansion of its academic activities and was declared as a 'Deemed University' on August 19, 1985 under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956 by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. The recognition has facilitated the award of recognized degrees by the Institute itself and paved the way for further expansion of the Institute as an academic institution. The faculty members and the supporting staff belong to diverse interdisciplinary backgrounds with specialisation in some core areas of population sciences, trained in India and abroad.

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
