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The Institute has completed 64 years of its glorious existence and I am happy to report the activities of the Institute for the academic year 2019-20.

Since its inception in 1956, IIPS had been conducting a one-year programme entitled “Certificate in Population Studies (CPS)” for trainees from various countries in Asia and the Pacific region.

The programme was initially funded by the UNESCAP and later by the UNFPA. Through this course, the Institute has trained personnel from various countries of Asia and the Pacific region, who occupy key positions in the field of population, health and development in government departments, universities and in international organizations. From the academic year 1991-92, this programme was re-designated as “Diploma in Population Studies (DPS)”. List of students who have completed the different teaching programmes of the Institute over the years and by country is presented in Tables A & B of the Appendix-1. From the academic year 2006-07, the Institute has extended its Diploma in Population Studies programme through distance learning.

In August 1985, IIPS was awarded the status of a Deemed University and in 1986, the Institute started awarding its own Ph.D. degree in Population Studies. Till date, the Institute has awarded Ph.D. degree to 346 candidates including 11 foreign candidates.

In 1988-89, the Institute started a one-year degree course entitled “Master of Population Studies (MPS)”. Till date, the Institute has awarded the MPS degree to 753 students. The MPS course was introduced through distance learning in 1994-95, and 458 students have been awarded MPS degree through distance learning till date.

From the academic year 2002-03, the Institute started a degree course in Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) in

Population Studies, and to date 563 students have been awarded the degree.

From the academic year 2009-10, IIPS has launched a new two-year degree course, viz. M.A / MSc in Population Studies for graduate students desiring to specialize in population studies. In the year 2013-14, the Institute introduced another two-year degree course, viz. Master of Science in Biostatistics and Epidemiology, which was later renamed as Master of Science in Biostatistics and Demography (MBD). Till date, 101 students have received the degree.

IIPS also awards Diploma in Health Education Promotion (DHPE),and a Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH). Both these courses are conducted by the National Institute of Public Health and Research, Mumbai, which is affiliated to IIPS. The one-year Diploma in Health Education (DHE) was initiated in August 1987 and later renamed as Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE) in 2001-02. So far 644 students including 28 foreign students have been awarded DHPE. The PGDCH was started in 2006-07 and to date 68 students have received diploma.

The Institute functions can be classified under categories of teaching, research, training, consultative services and documentation.

The Institute has seven academic departments with well qualified faculty members. The details of the teaching departments, Faculty members, and Group A officers is presented in Appendix II.

I. TEACHING PROGRAMME

1. REGULAR COURSES

During the academic year 2019-20, the Institute offered the following regular courses: (a) Diploma in Health

Promotion Education (DHPE), (b) Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH), (c) Master of Arts / Science in Population Studies (M.A / M.Sc.), (d) Master of Science in Biostatistics and Demography (MBD), (e) Master of Population Studies (MPS), (f) Master of Philosophy in Population Studies/Biostatistics & Demography (M.Phil.), and (g) Doctor of Philosophy in Population Studies/Biostatistics & Demography (Ph.D.). Apart from these programmes, the Institute also offers MA / MSc in Population Studies through distance learning.

The lists of students who are receiving diplomas / degrees in this academic year are given in Appendix III.

a. Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE)

This course is of one-year duration. During the current academic year, 21 students have successfully completed the course and qualify to get the degree. The list of students receiving DHPE for this academic year is given in Appendix III-1.

Dr. Dhaval Thorat is the Coordinator.

b. Post-Graduate Diploma in Community Health Care (PGDCH)

This course is of one-year duration. During the current academic year 10 students have successfully completed the course and qualify to get the degree. The list of students receiving PGDCH in this academic year is given in Appendix III-2.

Dr. Sudhir Wanje is the Coordinator.

c. Master of Arts / Science (M.A / M.Sc.) in Population Studies

The course is of two years duration. This academic year 31 students were admitted with Government of India fellowship and all have qualified for the award of the degree. The list of students receiving M.A / M.Sc. degree is given in Appendix III-3.

The 22 students currently enrolled for the programme (2019-21) is presented in Appendix IV-1.

Dr. Pralip Narzary and Dr. Laxmikant Dwivedi are the Coordinators.

d. Master of Science in Biostatistics and Demography (MBD)

The course is of two-years duration. This academic year

32 students were admitted with Government of India fellowship and all qualified for the award of the degree. The list of students receiving MBD degree for this academic year is given in Appendix III-4.

The 34 students currently enrolled for the program (2019-21) is presented in Appendix IV-2.

e. Master of Population Studies (MPS)

Holders of a Master's Degree from any recognized universities in relevant social science subjects are eligible for admission to the Master of Population Studies course. In this academic year, 45 students were admitted to MPS with the Government of India fellowship and all qualified for the award of the degree. The list of students receiving the MPS degree for this academic year is given in Appendix III-5.

Prof. Abhishek Singh and Dr. Dhanajay Bansod are the Coordinators.

f. Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) in Population Studies / Biostatistics and Demography

In the academic year, 62 students were admitted for the M.Phil. programme and all have successfully completed the requirement of the course. The list of students receiving degrees in this academic year is presented in Appendix III-6.

Prof. Chandra Shekhar and Dr. Suryakant Yadav are the Coordinators.

g. Doctor of Philosophy in Population Studies (Ph.D.)

The Institute has well qualified faculty to guide students admitted to the Ph.D. programme through a highly competitive process that involves their previous academic records, online entrance test, proposal writing, followed by personal interview. This academic year, 14 students have completed all the requirements for the award of Ph.D. degree. Appendix III-7 provides the list of successful candidates receiving the degree in this academic year for the award of the Ph.D. degree.

A total of 161 students are pursuing Ph.D. of them, 44 are recipients of the Government of India Research Fellowship, 61 are recipients of the UGC Fellowship, one is a recipient of BANR Fellowship, one student is a

recipient of UGC-FIP, and 30 students without fellowship. Eight students have submitted their thesis, and 16 students have presented their Synopsis. The details of the PhD students is presented in Appendix IV-3.

h. Post-Doctoral Fellowship (PDF)

Five students are presently pursuing Post-Doctoral degree and their details are presented in the Appendix IV-4.

I. DISTANCE LEARNING COURSES

The Institute has been recognized by the Distance Education Council for offering MPS and MA in Population Studies through Distance Learning.

a. M. A. in Population Studies (DISTANCE LEARNING)

On the recommendation of University Grants Commission, the Institute has started M.A. in Population Studies course for graduate degree holders from the academic year 2019-20. Currently 208 students are enrolled in this programme.

b. Master of Population Studies (MPS) (DISTANCE LEARNING)

This course is of two-years duration, although students have the flexibility of completing in a maximum period of four years. During this year, 11 students have completed all the requirements for the award of MPS degree (Distance Learning). Appendix III-8 provides the list of successful candidates receiving the degree in this academic year for the award of the MPS (DL).

In view of overwhelming demand from other countries, the course is now open to students from countries in the ESCAP region. Presently, 188 students are enrolled for this programme.

TERM PAPER / DISSERTATION

The seminar paper / dissertation constitutes a crucial part of the teaching programme of the Institute, as it contributes significantly to the development of research potential of the students. Towards the end of the course,

all students enrolled in various courses at the Institute are required to prepare a Term Paper (for MPS) or a dissertation (for M.A / M.Sc. in Population Studies, MBD, M.Phil.) under the guidance of a faculty supervisor. The students present their term papers / dissertations in a specially organized Student-Faculty Seminar. The term papers / dissertations are evaluated on the basis of content, interest and presentations / discussions in the seminars. Appendix V (Tables A, B, C, D, E and F) provides list of seminar papers / dissertations presented by the students during the current academic year (2019-20).

I. GOLD MEDAL

A student, each from DHPE and PGDCH programmes, whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best, is awarded the **IIPS Gold Medal**.

A student whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in the M.A / M.Sc. programme is awarded the **Prof. Asha A. Bhende Gold Medal**.

A student whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in the M.Sc. programme in Bio-Statistics and Demography (MBD) Is awarded the **Prof. S. Mukerji Gold Medal**.

A student from MPS programme, whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best, is awarded the **Dr. C. Chandrasekaran Gold Medal**.

A student whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in the M.Phil. programme is awarded **Prof. Tara Kanitkar Gold Medal**.

A student, whose overall performance is adjudged to be the best in the MPS (Distance Learning) programme, is awarded the **Prof. K. Srinivasan Gold Medal**.

II. SILVER MEDAL

IIPS Silver medals are awarded to students whose overall performance is ranked as the second best, in the respective programme – DHPE, PGDCH, M.A / M.Sc., MBD, MPS, MPS (Distance Learning) and M.Phil.

III. BEST PAPER / DISSERTATION

A student from MPS programme, whose term paper is rated as the best, is awarded the **Dr. J. R. Rele Award**. This award is based on the Seminar Paper's content, presentation and defense skill of the student while

presenting the paper at the Student–Faculty Seminar.

A student whose M.Phil. / Ph.D. thesis is adjudged to be the best is awarded the **Dr. P. N. Mari Bhat Gold Medal**. This award has been instituted in memory of Prof. P. N. Mari Bhat by his Family.

II. Training Programs organized by the Short Term Training Programme Unit

IIPS has a well-established Short Term Training Program (STTP) Unit. Prof Usha Ram and Prof. Archana K Roy are the Coordinators and Mr. Babu Santosh Kumar and Dr. Pazhani Murugesan are the research staff of the STTP unit. The unit periodically organizes training programs for the professionals, researchers, faculties, research scholars, NGO staff, Government officials and students from India and abroad. The training programs are usually of one to two-weeks duration addressing contemporary and relevant themes related to population, health, development, methods of data collection, analysis of large survey data, application of statistical software, etc. This academic year, the unit has organized two training

programs.

1. Training for Government Officials of the Himachal Pradesh

A one-week short term training programme on “Population & Demography Statistics” was organized by IIPS for officials working in the Department of Economics & Statistics and the Directorate of Health Services, Govt. of H.P, from 23rd to 28th September 2019. A total of fifteen officials from various districts of Himachal Pradesh attended the training programme. The program was customized such that the participants had more time to apply the concepts, techniques and measures using primary as well as secondary data for the state and districts of Himachal Pradesh using data from 2011 census and other sources including CRS, large scale sample surveys. In general, theory classes were conducted in the first half of the day and the second half was spent for hands on exercise where participants could apply demographic techniques and measures manually on excel sheet as well as with the help of various available demographic software.

2. Training Workshop on Large Scale Sample Surveys

A Large Scale Sample Survey Data User Training Workshop was organized by IIPS during 17th to 22nd February 2020. The 6-days training workshop covered all the aspects of Large Scale Sample Surveys, with special reference to the analysis of National Family Health Survey (NFHS-4). There were 35 participants from different Institutions and Universities across the country. The participants were from various disciplines such as

Economics, Sociology, Social Work, Public Health, Geography, Medicine, Nursing, Physiotherapy, etc. The topics covered during training were survey design, survey tools and instruments, quality control, methods and processes of data collection, sampling weights and sampling errors, data structure, analysis of calendar data, advanced statistical analysis at the national, state and district level and spatial analysis. All participants were issued certificates of participation at the conclusion of the training workshop.

III. ACTIVITIES ORGANIZED BY THE PUBLICATION CELL

IIPS has a well-established Publication Cell Unit, which looks after the publication of Newsletters, Research Briefs and Working Paper Series from the faculty members and other subject experts / scholars. Prof Usha Ram and Prof. Archana K Roy are the Coordinators of the PC unit. Mr. Babu Santosh Kumar and Dr. Pazhani Murugesan are assisting research staff. During the academic year, the publication cell organized the following activities:

1. Symposia and Guest Lectures

A. Symposium on World Population Prospect (WPP)

The Population Division of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs (DESA), United Nation launched World Population Prospect (WPP) on June 18, 2019. Following

this, IIPS PC and STTP organized a half-day symposium on “World Population Prospects 2019 Revision: Highlights and Implications for the Sustainable Development Goals for India” on 21st June 2019 to debate and discuss implications of the present and future demographic scenario of India and the world. Prof K S James, Director and Sr. Professor, IIPS chaired the symposium. The symposium had four sub-themes. Two speakers spoke on each sub theme. Prof. P. Arokiasamy, spoke on “Population Size, Growth and Composition: Implications for India and World” followed by a discussion by Prof Sumati Kulkarni. Prof. D A Nagdeva presented on “Levels and Trends in Fertility: Implications for India and World” and Prof F Ram discussed the implications. Prof. Usha Ram delivered her talk on “Levels and Trends in Mortality: Implications for India and World” and Prof. Kamla Gupta supplemented with her distinct viewpoints. Prof. K. C. Das presented on “Levels and Trends in

Migration: Implications for India and World" which was followed by expert opinion of Prof. M. H. Suryanarayana. After the presentation of all sub themes, there was interaction and discussion between the participants and

speakers. Former IIPS faculty and other invitees from research institutes and organizations across Mumbai, IIPS faculty, research staff and students attended the symposium.

B. Special lecture by Prof. Tim Dyson

Prof. Tim Dyson, Professor and a well-known demographer from Department of International Development at London School of Economics visited the Institute on June 28, 2019. Prof. Tim talked on Population history of Asia in reference to his recent book on, "Population History of India" published by the Oxford University Press. Prof. Dyson spoke at length about the journey of humans from first modern people (*homo sapiens*) roughly 70,000 years ago through the periods of Indus valley civilization, medieval period, colonial period to the present day India's population. The presentation was followed by an intensive question answer session. Former IIPS faculty and other invitees from research institutes and organizations across Mumbai, IIPS faculty, research staff and students attended the symposium.

Prof. Tim spent nearly two-hours with the IIPS research scholars learning about their doctoral work and gave lots of insights and suggestions on how they could improve their research.

C. THE WORLD POPULATION DAY, 2019

IIPS observed World Population Day on 10th of July 2019. The theme of this year WPD was "25 years of ICPD: Accelerating the Promises". Prof K S James, Director, IIPS, chaired the symposium and Prof Usha Ram, Publication Cell Coordinator conducted it. Dr Shireen Jejeebhoy was the chief guest of the programme, who described the importance of ICPD in which fragmented domains of health, i.e. pregnancy, MCH, family planning, HIV, Infertility access and quality of health care were brought under one umbrella. The distinguished speakers

for the day were Dr Venkatesh S, Assistant Representative, UNFPA, Dr. Kalpana Apte, Secretary General (CEO), FPA , Dr. Anita Kar, Founder, Birth Defects & Childhood Disability Research Centre and Ms Anuja Gulati, Consultant, UNFPA who covered various aspects and raised important issues of the ICPD agenda. The chief guest, Dr. Shireen highlighted the main concern of Nairobi Summit ICPD 25 and described the importance of ICPD, which brought the fragmented domains of health, i.e. pregnancy, MCH, family planning, HIV, Infertility access and quality of health care were brought under one umbrella.



Dr Venkatesh S, Assistant Representative, UNFPA, provided broad coverage to the central theme on ICPD: Journey so far and way ahead. Dr. Kalpana Apte, Secretary General (CEO), FPA spoke on 'Population Stabilization and SRHR: Linkages, Entitlement and Reality'. Dr Anita Kar, Founder, Birth Defects & Childhood Disability Research Centre, covered the less explored topic entitled, "Public Health Challenges of Birth Defects and Childhood Disabilities in India" and emphasized on the importance of congenital anomalies as a public health issue. Ms. Anuja Gulati, Consultant, UNFPA, gave her talk on Gender and Right Issues in Family planning and suggested that if we have to achieve the ICPD agenda, we need to emphasize on availability of the entire basket of choices; involvement of men; quality of service; build the capacity of medial and paramedical staff.

Two of the IIPS research scholar, Mr Prakash Kumar highlighted the issue of road traffic accidents, and Ms Mayanka Ambade spoke on ruralization, feminization and living arrangement of elderly. More than 150 persons including former IIPS faculty and other invitees from research institutes and organizations across Mumbai, IIPS faculty, research staff and students attended the symposium.

2. MEMORIAL LECTURE SERIES

A. 9th PROFESSOR ASHA A. BHENDE MEMORIAL LECTURE

The IIPS organized 9th memorial lecture in honour of Prof. Asha A Bhende on Nov 8, 2019. Prof. K S James, Director and Sr. Professor, IIPS, chaired the session. The guest speaker of the programme was Ms. Pooja Taparia, Founder and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of ARPAN. Prof. Usha Ram, coordinator, briefed the audience about the program and introduced the guest speaker Ms. Pooja Taparia, Ms. Pooja spoke on an extremely sensitive theme "Child Sexual Abuse: Ground Realities and Way Forward". She highlighted many important issues surrounding child sexual abuse including what is Child Sexual Abuse and the state of statistics on child sexual abuse. She stated that about 1.7 billion children experience some form of interpersonal violence in a span of one year. In her deliberation, she discussed both global and Indian scenario and emphasized on the ground realities in India and how the neglected issue has been missing from both policies and actions. She also debated on the methodological challenges in the estimation of child sexual abuse and questioned lack of knowledge on how much is the economic burden due to child sexual abuse and how long lasting and life threatening is its impact on those who experience it. The normative structure reinforces and perpetuates child sexual abuse. She highlighted the areas in which ARPAN as an institution is contributing to make the world a better and a safer place for our children.

The presentation was followed by an intense question answer session. The lecture concluded with a vote of thanks to all by Mr. Nasim A. Mondal, Research Officer, Publication Cell, IIPS. The event was attended by the former IIPS faculty members, IIPS faculties, research

staff, students and other invitees from various academic and research institutions.



B. 12th PROFESSOR P.N. MARI BHAT MEMORIAL LECTURE

IIPS has been organising a memorial lecture series in honour of late Prof Mari Bhat since year 2008. The 12th P N Mari Bhat Memorial Lecture was organized on Jan 8, 2020. Prof. Prabhu L Pingali, Professor in the Charles H Dyson School of Applied Economics & Management at the Cornell University, USA, with a joint appointment in the Division of Nutritional Sciences delivered the lecture this year. Prof Usha Ram, coordinator, STTP & PC read the citation on Prof P N Mari Bhat. Prof James introduced Prof. Pingali and honored him by presenting plant sapling, IIPS memento and a shawl. Prof. Pingali spoke on an important theme on "Can India Achieve SDG 2 – Eliminate Hunger and Malnutrition by 2030?". He extensively discussed about the status of India in context of SDG Goal-2, goal to bring an end to the hunger, including malnutrition through promoting agricultural sustainability. Unlike MGD, definition of malnutrition in SDG is broader and comprehensive. In India, though level of hunger and poverty has reduced in recent past, but still substantial number of people remain hungry and poor. Overall prevalence of stunting in poor states is higher than the Sub-Saharan African countries. On the other hand, there is a rise in prevalence of obesity and communicable diseases in advanced states. Moreover, small and poor farmers in semi-arid and flood prone areas in particular are going to be worst affected by the climate change. In his deliberation he emphasized that the small landholder is central to achieve SDG-2. He demonstrated about the changing diets pattern particularly in urban areas as an

opportunity for diversification of production systems. The presentation was followed by a question answer session with the audience. The event was attended by the former IIPS faculty members, IIPS faculties, research staff, students and other invitees from various academic and research institutions.

C. 18th DR. C. CHANDRASEKARAN MEMORIAL LECTURE

The IIPS organized 18th memorial lecture in honour of Prof C Chandrasekaran on 6th of March, 2020. The memorial lecture began with an invitation from Prof. Usha Ram to Dr. Jayant Kumar Banthia (Guest speaker), Prof K S James (Director) to the dais followed by lighting a ceremonial lamp by the Prof. K S James, Director and Sr. Professor, IIPS, Guest speaker and the retired faculties. Prof Usha Ram, coordinator, briefed the audience about the Prof. C Chandrasekaran and invited Prof James to chair the session and introduce the guest speaker Dr. Jayant Kumar Banthia. Dr. Banthia spoke on "Vital Statistics in India – Past, Present and Future". He began his talk stating that the Civil Registration and Vital Statistics (CRVS) has two major components. The first part of the data set (known as legal part or Civil Registration) establishes and records the key identity particulars of every individual, such as name, sex, date and place of birth (age), date and place of death, etc. The second data component (Vital Statistics) details the key health indicators for mother and children such as fertility (birth) rates, sex ratio at birth, high risk new born (through birth order, birth weight, gestation period etc.,) and indicators on death including maternal, infant and child mortality and causes of deaths for all section of population. He emphasized that a robust VS System lays the foundation for Good Governance in the country. The presentation was followed by an intense question

answer session from the audience and the experts. The lecture was concluded by a vote of thanks to all by Prof. Archana K Roy, Coordinator, STTP and Publication Cell, IIPS. The event was attended by the former IIPS faculty members, IIPS faculties, research staff, students and other invitees from various academic and research institutions.

3. IIPS Newsletter, Research Brief and Working Paper Series.

The Institute brings out "IIPS Newsletters", which publish information about various ongoing activities of the Institute. Two issues of IIPS Newsletter were printed during the academic year 2019-20. The publication of 'Research Brief Series' started in 2007, to provide an opportunity to the faculty, Ph.D. students and visiting fellows to quickly disseminate the important findings of their research studies before they are published as a research report or in a scientific journal. So far 19 research briefs have been published under this series. The 'Working Paper Series' was started during 2009-10. Its main objective is to disseminate new research ideas, theoretical development and methodological insights initiated by IIPS to the national and international community as quickly as possible. The papers published under this series are peer-reviewed by two external experts working in the areas of Population, Health and Development. So far, 18 working papers have been published.

IV. NATIONAL SEMINAR

IIPS has organised a national seminar on "Population, Health and Sustainable Development Goals: Performance

and Prioritizing Policies" in collaboration with Population Research Centre, Patna University during 13-15 February 2020 at Patna, Bihar. The purpose of the seminar was to understand the synergy between demographic changes in India in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and its laudable objective that no one should be left behind. Hon'ble Education Minister of Bihar Shri Krishna Nandan Prasad Verma inaugurated the seminar and Prof. Rash Bihar Singh, Vice Chancellor; Patna University presided over the function. In the inaugural address, Hon'ble Education Minister highlighted the population issues in Bihar and how it hinders the development process. He also talked about Bihar's Education and how it has been reshaped in recent years through implementation of various programmes. Dr. KS James, the Director & Sr. Prof. highlighted the importance of seminar and Prof. DA Nagdeve provided the details on the structure of the conference. The fact sheet of IIPS funded Project "Causes and Consequences of out Migration from Middle Ganga Plain" was also released during the inaugural session.

There were a total of two plenary sessions on the topics "Health and Development" and "Development in Bihar", three special sessions on "Data Quality in NFHS", "Gender" and "Migration" in addition to the 92 oral presentations in 12 technical sessions and 105 poster presentations. Plenary session on Health and Development focused on family planning scenario, major challenges in reaching to the vulnerable population groups and the role of recent policy initiatives such as *Ayushman Bharat* in ensuring universal health care. Another plenary session on "Development in Bihar" majorly dealt with the roadblocks in the development of Bihar including high total fertility rate, early marriage, illiteracy rate among women, neo-natal mortality, Infrastructure etc.

The conference concluded with valedictory session, including a brief presentation on the three-day workshop by Dr. LK Dwivedi, and distribution of best poster awards. Shri Sanjay Kumar, IAS, Principal Secretary-Health, Dept. of Health, Govt. of Bihar, delivered the valedictory address by highlighting several issues confronting population stabilization efforts in Bihar. He assured that the papers presented on Bihar's development would be taken note by the government for the implementation of various policies and programmes. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Patna University addressed the valedictory session and emphasized how deliberations in the conference help

the policy makers especially in Bihar. The Director & Sr. Professor of IIPS, Dr. K. S James thanked Patna University for making the seminar successful. At last, Prof. D.A. Nagdeve proposed the vote of thanks, to close the 3-day seminar.

Around 300 delegates attended the seminar. In addition to the Indian participants, international delegates also attended the seminar from Carleton University, Canada, University of California, and San Diego, USA etc.

V. NFHS Seminar

International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) Mumbai in collaboration with Population Council New Delhi, National Council for Applied Economics Research (NCAER), and Center for Gender Equity and Health University of California San Diego organized an international seminar on 'Twenty-five years of National Family Health Survey (NFHS) in India: Lessons Learnt and Way Forward' in India Habitat Center, New Delhi during October 18-19 2019. The seminar was inaugurated by Shri Ashwini Kumar Choubey, the Honorable Minister of State Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW), Government of India in the august presence of Prof. K.S. James Director & Senior Professor IIPS, Mr. Keith Simmons Acting Mission Director USAID/India, Shri Manoj Jhalani Additional Secretary and Mission Director MoHFW, Shri Pravin Srivastava, Chief Statistician of India and Secretary Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI), and Dr. Vinod K. Paul Honorable Member NITI Aayog. The seminar had 5

specially organized panels on various topics related to conduct and use of survey research. A special issue of SSM-Population Health devoted to measurement of women's empowerment in different settings was launched in the seminar followed by a special panel to discuss relevant issues related to women's empowerment in India. Twenty-four oral papers were presented in 6 technical sessions by national and international experts. Two poster sessions were also organized in the seminar.

Over 100 participants including 16 international participants participated in the seminar. A number of officials from the MoHFW also participated in the seminar in the capacity of Chair/Co-chair. Prof. Harshad Thakur, Director, National Institute for Health and Family Welfare, presided over the Valedictory session of the seminar.



F. Staff Welfare Committee (SWC)



XV. LIBRARY

The International Institute for Population Sciences library has a collection of resources taking into consideration

the course contents and research needs of the Institute. It holds about 86,570 books, 17,943 bound volumes of periodicals, 17,137 reprints and 640 audio-visual materials and subscribes to over 300 (Print + Online) journals. There are 27,420 research articles from the core journals and edited books indexed and made available through Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). The library has the collection on population studies and its principal domains including, philosophy, psychology, religion, sociology, statistics, economics, education, mathematics, anthropology, public health, history, geography, etc. The library provides a host of information services to its users, like Current Awareness, New Additions, Selective Dissemination of Information, Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), Document Delivery Service, Photocopy facilities, Reference Service, Bibliographic service, metadata interpolation and so on.

The library has a special collection of all the census volumes of published in the pre-independence period (Census of India 1872 to 1941 in PDF format) till the latest Census 2011. The library provides access to the several online databases like JSTOR, SCIENCE DIRECT (social science collection), SCOPUS, INDIASTAT and other leading publisher's online collection relevant to health and population sciences. The library provides remote access through iProx21 for 2000+ online (full-text) journals to the authorized users.

The IIPS library has an institutional membership with INFLIBNET (UGC), DELNET, IASLIC, NIRD, IASSI and exploring maximum services for the benefit of the Institute. The Institute is an active member of Shodhganga, Indcat programmes of the INFLIBNET of UGC.

The library has reading hall equipped with comfortable furniture, air-condition and Wifi facility. The library working hours are 8 a.m. to 11.00 p.m. (Mon-Fri) and 9.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. on Saturdays. The library is in the process of creating Institutional repository i.e. digitizing the Institute publications to provide remote access to its patrons. An introduction of Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) to the library, Identification of Core Collection of Population Studies; digitization of State level Census Volumes of India are the major activities of the IIPS library by 2020.

XVI. INFORMATION COMMUNICATION AND TECHNOLOGY UNIT

Information, Communication, and Technology (ICT) Unit provides an effective and developmental ICT service to faculty, staff, and students of the Institute. The unit manages the information technology infrastructure to provide IT services; the ICT division evaluates and installs the proper hardware and software necessary to keep the network functioning properly. Under the National Knowledge Network project, the Institute has acquired a 1-Gbps internet link from NIC. The IIPS Local Area Network comprises both wired (fibre optic) and wireless (Wi-Fi) networks and connects all computers and mobile devices in the Institute. Students, staff, and faculty have 24*7 internet access on the campus. Unit monitor the network for security breaches, respond to cyber-attacks, keeping organizations safe from malicious digital attacks, implementing and running security software, scanning for abnormalities, upgrading systems Monitor and configure networks to optimize performance, and resolve faults.

The ICT unit is equipped with the latest core i7 or higher generation computers. Moreover, the necessary statistical software, such as IBM SPSS Version 26, STATA Version 16, SAS 9.4, and ArcGIS Pro 2.x, NVIVO required to analyse demographic datasets are installed with a multiuser license. In addition, important software such as MORTPAK, Endnote X7, and ATLAS.ti have also been installed. The IT department creates, maintains, and updates information on the institute's website & Social media account regularly. The webmaster and professionals in the ICT division design the website's layout, write the programming code, and test its usability. The unit provides webmail service enabling remote access to its users, technical support to the eGovernance (eOffice) application and Video Conferencing tools viz. Skype, Zoom, Webex (Cisco) for online training programs, workshops, seminars, meetings and classes including Moodle, a learning management system.

Additionally, the Institute has a robust Data Centre comprising network-attached to the server to enable storing and disseminating demographic datasets. The Data Centre currently has all relevant datasets such as census, various rounds of large-scale surveys conducted by IIPS, which can be directly accessed by IIPS users. Through a web portal, online databases of surveys by IIPS are also disseminated to the registered users. The

ICT unit has one primary computer lab equipped with 48 personal computers and three LCD projectors and another small lab with 16 personal computers all connected via the internet.

Prof. S. K. Singh is in-charge, ICT Unit and Mr. A. K. Mishra is System Manager.

XVII. PLACEMENT CELL

To facilitate graduating students find suitable job opportunities, a Placement Cell was established at the Institute in 2010. This Cell contacts various organizations / Institutes working in the field of population, health and related areas and conveys the CVs and information about the passing out students to them.

The Cell also facilitates conducting campus interviews for organizations interested in recruiting from IIPS. This provides a unique opportunity for the employers and students to interact with each other for the benefit of both.

Dr. Aparajita Chattopadhyay and Dr. Manas R. Pradhan are the coordinators.

XVIII. HOSTEL FACILITY

The teaching and training programme at the Institute are mostly residential. The Institute has two hostels. All the rooms are self-contained, well-furnished and having adequate living and working space. Three VIP rooms are available in Guest House with furnished Kitchen and Dining room.

There is a hostel mess run on no-loss no-profit basis by a committee consisting of student representatives, hostel staff and hostel warden. LCD televisions are also provided exclusively for students' use in both hostels. Indoor and outdoor game facilities and a gymnasium are also available.

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
