





Role of IIPS in my Academic Journey

Tell us about yourself: I have worked mostly on mathematical theorems and models. My research has been covered in the media over 700 times across several fields, including artificial intelligence, medicine, public health, mathematics, poultry farming, and civil and computer engineering, but my greatest satisfaction comes from my contribution to



applied research aimed at solving real world problems in the field of population.

Currently, I am Professor and Director of the Laboratory for Theory and Mathematical Modeling, Medical College of Georgia at Augusta University, USA. I have also taught and conducted research at several prestigious institutions in India and other countries, such as the Indian Statistical Institute, the Indian Institute of Science, University of Guelph, and the University of Oxford. I have had the privilege of collaborating closely with several world-class scientists, including Dr. C.R. Rao, Dr. Steven G. Krantz, Dr. J.K. Ghosh, Dr. Brad Efron, Dr. David R. Cox, Dr. James Carey, Dr. Philip Maini, Dr. Robert M. May, and Dr. Roy M. Anderson.

I am excited to share that an invited chapter I wrote, titled "Mathematical Demography" will be published in 2025 in the book "Encyclopedia of Social Measurement" to be published by Elsevier. This 65-page chapter readily adoptable as a course provides a concise overview of mathematical demography, specifically tailored for students interested in the theories and modeling of demography.

How did you begin your journey in IIPS? My career at the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) began in 1995 when I enrolled in the Master of Population Studies (MPS) program. In 1996, I started the PhD program in IIPS. I left IIPS in early 1998 to become a Senior Research Fellow (SRF) and Visiting Scientist in the Statistics and Mathematics Unit of the Indian Statistical

Institute (ISI) in Kolkata, following an invitation from Dr. J.K. Ghosh. I was awarded PhD degree in 2000. After that I constantly kept in touch with the Institute. Here I delivered guest lectures, and also conducted short courses, workshops, etc. I encouraged several of my classmates and juniors from Andhra University to study in IIPS. In this institute I made numerous friends from across India and abroad. IIPS has consistently attracted students from all Indian states and abroad, creating a diverse and enriching learning environment. I was exposed to several brilliant teachers of mathematics and statistics at Andhra University, which produced in me an appreciation for mathematical demography in IIPS.

Teaching quality in IIPS is always of the highest standards, and the library has a rich collection of books. In Indian Demography, I was inspired by the transformative leadership of Profs. K.B. Pathak, J.R. Rele, S. Mukherjee and P.V. Sarma. They provided genuine leadership in IIPS's growth, Indian demographic studies in India, and new developments in demography. Meeting students from almost all the states in India and a few cities from abroad and exchanging culture and ideas were some of the nice things that happened to me. I will always cherish them. During my stay at IIPS the Institute provided a friendly and professional work environment. IIPS provided an excellent opportunity to understand applied subjects and illustrate how national population planning and development can be organized through mathematical and statistical techniques.

Do you want to say anything on IIPS's Position in the Global Demographic Community? IIPS holds a special place in the careers of many, including myself. I highly recommend it to mathematicians, statisticians, and students from other disciplines as an excellent institution to gain exposure to key aspects of population and development, which are essential for national-level planning. As mentioned above, IIPS is one of the best institutions for demographic sciences in the world and provides a fantastic environment for networking with students from India and abroad.

Do we have any message for the IIPSAA community?

IIPS, its alumni, and demographic researchers in the country can help the institute in many ways. The major source of functioning of IIPS projects is through federal government funds. IIPS combined with IIPSAA, proactively need to step-in as a think tank on emerging population issues in the country. Demographers also need to be involved with the political & administrative process of population policy formations that are compatible with the national interests. Traditional

population research in the country is in very good shape, but the demographic leadership in the country is lacking to take up effectively the newest and emerging population problems faced by the country. Leadership is also needed in fostering collaborations between demographers and scientists in other disciplines to address several emerging population issues in the country. We need the leadership who constantly supplies energy that motivates the dedicated demographers (both junior and senior) and participates in the basic research for the planning of the country. Greater responsibilities prevail on population associations in the country to lead the demographic community and to coordinate demographic research activities.



General Body Meeting of IIPSAA

The Sixth General Body Meeting of the IIPS Alumni Association (IIPSAA) took place on February 10, 2023, at 2:30 PM IST in hybrid mode. The meeting was commended with a welcome address and remarks by the President, Prof. Irudaya Rajan S, followed by the Patron's address by Prof. Srikant Singh, Director (Additional Charge) of IIPS, Mumbai. Prof. Nandita Saikia, General Secretary, presented and sought approval for the annual report and minutes of the fifth General Body meeting held on March 1, 2022, and presented the General Secretary's report.



The reasurers Dr. T. R. Dilip and Mr. Rambachan presented and sought approval for the audited income and expenditure statements and balance sheets for the financial years 2021-22 and 2022-23.

A detailed plan of activities was discussed, including a roundtable with retired faculty, a marathon event to raise funds, academic and employment opportunities for alumni, rural employment initiatives, a cancer awareness event, and a workshop on Bayesian statistics by Prof. Sayeed Unisa. Additional discussions were held to cover funding for students, memorial lectures, and donations. During the Sixth General Body Meeting of the IIPS Alumni Association (IIPSAA), Prof. Sayeed Unisa shared insights from a recent roundtable meeting with retired IIPS faculty members.

The meeting highlighted a desire for more frequent interactions with retired faculty members, and Prof. Unisa proposed celebrating a "Pension Day" at the IIPS campus for reconnecting and contributing to student initiatives. Other suggestions included organizing online lectures on health management, healthcare events, and events focusing on PhD and employment opportunities involving internationally recognized faculty members. Prof. K. C. Das emphasized leveraging retired faculty expertise for drafting grant proposals and conducting workshops on advanced techniques. He also proposed memorial lectures to honor distinguished individuals, initiatives to expand IIPSAA's membership among distance learning students, and the creation of a dedicated IIPSAA website. N. P. Gandhi suggested compiling a book celebrating retired professors' contributions. He also advocated for the establishment of Indian Population Services, akin to Indian Economic Services, through governmental channels. Additionally, Dr. Sujata Verma expressed her intention to contribute funds in memory of her late husband to assist students in need. Concluding the meeting, Prof. R. Nagarajan, Vice-President of IIPSAA, delivered a vote of thanks to all the attendees for participation in the meeting and for their suggestions to improve the working of IIPSAA.

Major Activities of IIPSAA


Between June 2023 and December 2024, the IIPS Alumni Association (IIPSAA) organized numerous workshops, webinars, and lectures with the active involvement of its members. These events featured renowned demographers who delivered motivational and academic lectures, providing valuable insights to students and early-career faculty. Over the past year, several impactful lectures have been organized, receiving widespread appreciation for their relevance and depth. The details of these lectures are outlined below.

Event 1 | April 5th, 2024 "How to Get PhD Admission Abroad"

To support current students of IIPS, IIPSAA organized an online workshop on April 5, 2024. The resource persons for the session included Ms. Shriya Bajaj, a PhD scholar at the University of Sheffield, England; Ms. Shalini Singh, a PhD scholar at the University of Vienna, Austria; Mr. Rahul Kumar Jha, a PhD scholar at the University of Manchester, England; and Mr. Nasim Ahamed Mondal, from the University of Warsaw, Poland. During the workshop, the speakers shared their experiences of applying to PhD programs at foreign universities and expressed their willingness to




guide the students aspiring to join doctoral program abroad. The participants greatly appreciated this event.



The session was chaired by IIPSAA General Secretary, Prof. Nandita Saikia, and moderated by Mr. Mihir Adhikary and Ms. Neha Kumari, both current PhD scholars of IIPS. Over 50 students attended the event making it a highly beneficial and impactful initiative for the participants.

Event 2 | 15th May 2024 "Importance and Future of Demography"

On May 15, 2024, IIPSAA organized an interactive session titled "Importance and Future of Demography" for students and alumni, featuring Prof. T. K. Roy, Former Director and Senior Professor of IIPS. The event was held at the seminar hall of IIPS and simultaneously broadcasted via the Webex online platform. The session was chaired by IIPSAA Vice-President, Prof. Sayeed Unisa, and concluded with a vote of thanks by Prof. Nagarajan. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from numerous attendees, who benefited immensely from the engaging discussion.





Event 3 | 27th May 2024 "Post Opportunities in European Universities"

IIPSAA hosted an online webinar on the topic "Postdoc Opportunities in European Universities" on May 27, 2024. This event provided valuable insights into the challenges and opportunities associated with pursuing higher studies in Europe. The webinar features distinguished alumni who share their experiences and advice on post-doctoral opportunities in European Universities. The speakers were Dr. Saddaf Naz Akhtar, a postdoctoral Fellow at the University of Southampton, and Dr. Babul Hossain, a Postdoctoral fellow at Luxemburg Institute of Health, Luxemburg. More than 75 students participated in this event.





Event 4 | 19th June 2024 "Population Dynamics, and its Impact on Family & Living Arrangements for the Elderly People"


On 19th June 2024, Prof. Sumati Kulkarni, Former Faculty, IIPS delivered a speech on "Population Dynamics, and its Impact on Family & Living Arrangements for the Elderly People". The session was chaired by Prof. Sayeed Unisha. Dr. Bashir A. Bhat introduced the speaker. Prof. Kulkarni highlighted the evolving dynamics of elderly care, noting that many elderly people prefer independent living despite most of them still living with their children and being satisfied. She

attributed the shift to longer lifespans, children's migration to urban or overseas locations, and the influence of technology and consumerism. Additionally, she mentioned a "time banking system" as a potential solution, where younger individuals offer services for future support. Different socioeconomic classes adopt varying approaches, such as old age homes and assisted living facilities. The session ended with a vote of thanks by Prof. Nandita Saikia.



Event 5 | **11**th **July 2024** "Positioning Demography and Demographers in The Indian Context"

On the occasion of World Population Day, Prof. K Srinivasan, Former Director, IIPS gave a special talk on "Positioning Demography and Demographers in The Indian Context". The session was chaired by IIPSAA president Prof. Irudaya Rajan. IIPSAA. Vice President Prof Sayeed Unisa introduced the distinguished speaker. Dr. Thiagarajan, an alumnus of IIPS gave the vote of thanks. The talk emphasized integrating demographic studies with other disciplines to enhance employability and address societal issues. Concerns were raised about the declining status of demography in academia and the job market, highlighting the need for innovative approaches to attract students. He said that collaboration with other fields and promoting demographic training in government roles can increase visibility of demography. New programs like survey research and data analytics aim to meet industry demands and improve job prospects for demography graduates. About 66 participants attended this meeting through online mode.



Event 6 | 22nd July 2024 "A Partition Theorem in Populations"

Prof. Arni S. R. Srinivasa Rao, Professor and Director, Laboratory for Theory and Mathematical Modeling, Medical College of Georgia, USA gave a talk on "A Partition Theorem in Populations". This event was chaired by Prof. Nandita Saikia, the general secretary of IIPSAA. In his talk, Prof Arni



presented a theorem that describes how a randomly selected large population can be partitioned into stationary and non-stationary components. The theorem demonstrates that there is a property that can be used to determine whether a component of a large population is stationary or non-stationary. This is an important result for modeling and analyzing complex populations, as it provides a mathematical framework for understanding how different subgroups within a

population may be behaving differently over time. About 35 faculty members and students of IIPS participated in this talk. Dr. Kunal Keshri, gave a heartfelt appreciation to Prof Arni.




Event 7 | 15th September 2023 *Workshop on "IUSSP: the world community of population specialists, its relevance for Indian scientists"*

The International Institute for Population Sciences Alumni Association (IIPSAA) and Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), IIPS, Mumbai organized a workshop on "IUSSP: the world community of population specialists, its relevance for Indian scientists" to apprise the Indian population community about the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population (IUSSP) and the role it plays in furthering scientific knowledge both globally and in individual countries, including India. The main speakers of the webinar were the office bearers of IUSSP, including its President, Secretary General and Executive Director, as well as faculty and students who have been involved in IUSSP activities. Their remarks focused on several issues such as what IUSSP does, how Indians are engaged in its activities, and how its work affects India's demographic and development scenarios. The IUSSP's flagship event is the International Population Conference. Some questions that got clarified in the event are: What are plans for IPC2025 and how can Indian scientists contribute and participate in it? What are the experiences of India's population experts and students who are members of IUSSP? What are the non-members missing? What are the advantages of IUSSP membership for students and early career scholars, as well as faculty and others interested in population matters? What are the administrative procedures and financial implications?

The session provided a comprehensive overview of key organizations and events in the field of population studies, with a focus on the IUSSP and its engagement with Indian scholars. Dr. Irudaya Rajan, President of IIPSAA, offered insights into the association's objectives, while Dr. Nandita Saikia, Head of the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) in IIPS and Secretary of IIPSAA, highlighted the center's contributions to advancing population research and education. Dr. Shireen Jejeebhoy, President of IUSSP, elaborated on the organization's role in shaping global demographic research and its impact on India's development landscape.

Mary Ellen Zuppan, Executive Director of IUSSP, discussed the plans for the upcoming International Population Conference 2025 (IPC2025), emphasizing its significance for the global population research community. Experiences shared by Indian population experts, including Dr. Chander Shekhar, Dr. K.G. Santhya, and Dr. T.V. Sekher, alongside student members Ankita Srivastava and Ankit Sikarwar, underscored the value of active participation in IUSSP activities. Dr. Laura Wong, Vice President of IUSSP, detailed the benefits for students and early-career scholars, as well as membership renewal processes and financial considerations. The session concluded with an interactive discussion, fostering deeper engagement and understanding among attendees. More than 90 participants attended this event physically or online.

IIPSAA Members in Leadership Positions

Prof. Shireen Jejeebhoy, visiting faculty in IIPS is the President of the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population (IUSSP)

Prof. Shireen Jejeebhoy, a former faculty member in IIPS and currently serving as a visiting faculty, has been an independent researcher since 2016. Her work primarily focuses on adolescent health, gender-based violence, and sexual and reproductive health rights. Previously, she served as Senior Associate at the Population Council, India (2002–2016), leading studies on youth, gender, and unsafe abortion. At WHO (1998–2002), she worked on adolescent health and reproductive care.



Prof. Jejeebhoy has held key positions in the IUSSP and APA councils, contributing significantly to population studies. Currently, she is the President of IUSSP, a testament to her leadership in the field.

Prof. K S James, Former Director and Senior Professor in IIPS is the President of the Asian Population Association (APA)

Prof. K S James, Senior Visiting Scholar at Newcomb Institute, Tulane University, is an expert in demography, with a focus on South Asian studies. Formerly Director of IIPS, Mumbai, he has also served as a professor at JNU, New Delhi, and ISEC, Bangalore. His research explores the socio-economic and policy impacts on demographic factors like fertility, marriage, gender, and ageing, with key focus areas in demographic change, ageing, and data systems. Widely published in leading journals, his work on India's demographic transition, population dividend, and data quality is highly regarded. He has held visiting fellowships at institutions like Harvard University, LSE, IIASA, and others. Prof. James holds a PhD from JNU and postdoctoral training from Harvard University. Earlier, he served as the Vice-President of the Asian Population Association and a member of Kerala's Urban Policy Commission. Currently, he is the President of Asian Population Association.

Prof. U. S. Mishra, faculty in IIPS and President of Indian Health Economics and Policy Association (IHEPA)

Prof. Udaya Shankar Mishra, Professor in IIPS, Mumbai, and former professor at CDS, Trivandrum, has over 29 years of experience in population policies, health, gender, poverty, and human development. A PhD graduate from IIPS, he has an extensive publication record addressing demographic transitions and socio-economic disparities. A Takemi Fellow at Harvard, he has collaborated with WHO and other global organizations and contributed to policy-focused projects. Known for his research and teaching in population studies and poverty measurement, Prof. Mishra's work significantly advances public health and development policy. Currently he is the president of Indian Health Economics and Policy Association (IHEPA).

Prof. T. V Shekhar, faculty in IIPS and President of Indian Association of Social Sciences and Health (IASSH)

Prof. T.V. Sekher is Professor in the Department of Population Policies and Programs at the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai. With a PhD in Population Studies from the Institute for Social and Economic Change, Bangalore, his expertise spans social demography, gender issues, ageing, health systems, and reproductive health. Prof. Sekher has served as a Principal Investigator for numerous national and international projects, including the Longitudinal Ageing Study in India (LASI) and studies on gender



discrimination and health services. A Fulbright Fellow at Cornell University, he has held visiting fellowships at leading institutions globally, including Lund University, France's Maison des Sciences de l'Homme, and the Wellcome Trust in London. Widely published in journals and books, Prof. Sekher is recognized for his contributions to gender studies, public health, and ageing research. He is also a member of several academic associations, including the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population (IUSSP) and the Population Association of America (PAA). Prof. Sekhar is the President of Indian Association of Social Sciences and Health (IASSH) since 2023.

Prof. Suresh Sharma, alumunus of IIPS and President Indian Association for the Study of Population (IASP)

Prof. Suresh Sharma is Professor and Head of the Population Research Centre, Institute of Economic Growth (IEG), Delhi, with over 30 years of research experience. His expertise spans demography, reproductive and child health, family planning, ageing, and tribal health. He has authored nine books, published over 50 research papers, and led numerous national and international health projects, including NFHS, DLHS, and LASI. Prof. Sharma has collaborated extensively with ministries and global organizations,




including the MoHFW, World Bank, and UNFPA, contributing to health policy and program evaluations. Currently he serves as the President of the Indian Association for the Study of Population and is the Asia-Pacific Editor of the Springer Journal of Population Aging.

IIPSAA Achievers at Global and National Platforms

Prof. Krishnamurthy Srinivasan as IUSSP's 33rd Laureate

The International Union for the Scientific Study of Population (IUSSP) has recognized **Prof. Krishnamurthy Srinivasan** as its 33rd Laureate for his exceptional contributions to demography as a researcher, teacher, and evaluator of family planning programs. A visionary leader, Prof. Srinivasan served as the **Director of the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai, for over 14 years**, where he transformed the nature of demographic



teaching and research, that helped the entire demographic community of Asia.

His pivotal role in initiating India's Demographic Health Survey, the **National Family Health Survey (NFHS)** in 1992, marked a milestone as one of the largest demographic and health surveys globally. He also contributed to shaping India's statistical and population policies as a member of the Indian National Statistical Commission and the Working Group on Population Policy for the sixth five-year plan (1980-85).

Prof. Arun Kumar Sharma as Chief-Editor of Demography India

Prof. Arun Kumar Sharma, who retired from IIT Kanpur as a senior professor, has been appointed as the Chief Editor of Demography India, the official online publication of the Indian Association for the Study of Population (IASP). Published continuously for nearly fifty years, the journal is dedicated to exploring population dynamics in India and beyond.



Interdisciplinary in nature, *Demography India* serves as a platform for national and international scholars to share their research findings on diverse issues related to population and development. The journal reflects evolving trends in population studies, starting with technical aspects of fertility, mortality, migration, and urbanization estimation in the 1970s. Over time, it has expanded to cover population policy, reproductive health, gender and empowerment, nutrition, employment, and the impact of digitalization.





My tribute to Dr Arvind Pandey – A dear friend who is always present

With a profound sense of personal loss, I write this tribute to Prof. Arvind Pandey. He was a close friend, colleague, and confidant in countless ways that are hard to express in words. Death can often bring people closer to appreciating life—a curious yet genuine truth. Reflecting back on my 42 years of long association with him, I have become acutely aware of the above dictum. We were engaged in relationships so much on a day-to-day basis that we, more often than not, took some of those moments of togetherness, fun and laughter for granted, never realising that each of those moments was cultivated carefully and nurtured with lots of mutual sensitivities and respect. Only after his passing did I realise how much of those irretrievable moments were a boon to us and brought so much meaning and joy to our lives that went far beyond our professional affinities. I distinctly remember meeting with him for the first time in the IIPS canteen, which used to be on the top floor of the old hostel, when he came for the interview for his selection as lecturer. I was already entrenched in IIPS, having arrived over one and a half years before him. It was the summer of 1982, and Mumbai had begun to feel warm and sultry, awaiting dearly much-awaited June rain. As a newly appointed hostel warden and especially with loads of UN fellows living in the hostel, I regularly visited the hostel canteen, especially because food was the most contentious issue and Mumbai weather was most hostile to our foreign students during that time. Not that I could do

much about either; I always thought that the physical presence of someone from authority with empathetic sharing of similar distress would ease the building of perspective and reasonableness in our critical stances. I, in any case, enjoyed constructive confrontations. On that day, I met Dr Pandey in the canteen, awaiting his interview post lunch. He was clearly anxious and yet, was perhaps silently enjoying my animated yet awkward engagements and navigation with the students on those tricky and unresolvable issues! I had never met him before, but I quickly noticed him and reached out with my introduction. During that first meeting, Dr Pandey put me at ease with his approachable demeanour and absence of an elitist BHU aura. This contrasted with my notions about individuals from the BHU statistics department at that time, who often viewed themselves as part of an elite statistical institution. There was already a significant presence of BHU persons in IIPS those days. I was expecting him to show some of those attitudes or, at minimum, a consciousness of this background, and I deliberately led him toward seeing where it all lands! However, he seemed oblivious to this and, on the contrary, was curious to know how I landed up in IIPS with no specific background in demography or statistics and sounded like an extraterrestrial!! Our conversation was interesting, and we had a good laugh and dig at each other. This conversation defined his unassuming, relatable personality for me. We have never looked back since then; we have always sincerely enjoyed and appreciated trying to find the uniqueness in each other and what that could mean while working and living together under one umbrella. This lasted till the very last day he passed away. We nurtured a freshness in our relationship and always drew positive energy from each other. The loving bond between Anju, his daughter and Pooja, our daughter, enriched our lives profoundly.

Prof. Pandey acknowledged his value and was unafraid to seek recognition for his principles and achievements. Fortunately, he was also duly recognized during his lifetime for his contributions to the field as a professional, and for the impact he had on the lives and careers of many students and staff, he mentored and supported. I always thought he was perhaps easily the most popular and accessible person among the staff and students in IIPS. This relationship with his students continued and lasted till his last. He was my 'go-to' person when I wanted to reach out to someone with whom we had a remote connection in the past. Unbelievably, he could discover that person's connections, no matter how distant. He could do this effortlessly because he had an extensive network of colleagues, friends, and students who always stayed in touch with him, and he was with them. It was incredible how he maintained such relationships and a vast network of friends despite the high demands of his busy professional life. He was never stressed about this and was always willing to offer advice and suggestions to anyone seeking help. His excellent IASP Presidency, several academic publications, invaluable advice and guidance to innumerable programs and organisations, the large number of students he guided and left behind as his legacy, and the conference of coveted awards and recognitions are only a few testimonies to his solid presence and tangible contributions. There are several that I don't wish to recount here as Prof. Dwivedi has already compiled Dr. Pandey's achievements in his moving obituary to him in the newsletter of the Indian Society for Medical Statistics (ISMS) in June 2024. However, I always felt Dr Pandey deserved much more, and life was a little unfair to him to slip away too early. His contributions to

an ambitious and complex intervention project we at ICRW implemented in Jharkhand were exceptional. His penchant for real-life experiments and learning from people's lives brought him close to our work. Seeing his unwavering enthusiasm, I always have a nagging sense that if he lived longer, he would have taken a profound plunge into real-life projects and added to his already enriched rapporteur of wisdom and connectedness.

We will surely miss Dr. Pandey, a kind individual whose genuine smile radiated positivity and hope all around him.

My first interaction with Prof. Guruswamy (popularly known as 'Guru') was in 1987 when I joined the institute's MPhil/PhD programme. After completing his doctoral degree from ANU, Canberra, he became a faculty in IIPS. Being from the same place (Bangalore), it was easy for me to relate with him, and ours was more than a student-teacher relationship; we were like a family. However, he was professional when taking MPhil classes on Population and Development and was easily accessible to students. He would go out of his way to help students. With impeccable English and expertise in his specialized domain, he would help students improve the technical side and language of the term papers, irrespective of whomever the guide was.

My interaction with him became more frequent when I was working on my PhD thesis with Prof. Srinivasan. Prof. Srinivasan, being busy as the Director, could spend little time with me, and he therefore assigned Guru to be the first reviewer of my thesis drafts. The most important thing that I learnt from Guru was an improvement in English writing skills, and the other one was his way of visualizing and interpreting the data- "don't look at numbers as numbers and look at numbers as people" (verbatim). I think I gained a lot from him, which helped me in the professional career I just completed with the United Nations Population Fund.

My last interaction with Guru and Uma (his wife) was in 2021, after COVID-19, and before I was deployed in Thailand. We spent a good 2-3 hours chatting, which brought back nostalgic memories of the institute and things that we had done in group. I didn't realize that it would be my last interaction with Guru.

Professor Guruswamy will be remembered for the lasting relationships he built while in IIPS. His cheerful nature, often accompanied by his trademark chain-smoking, created a welcoming and lively atmosphere. He had an extraordinary ability to make everyone feel at ease, drawing us into discussions while always ready to share a thoughtful laugh. This blend of wit and humour set him apart, and we will all deeply miss him.

Professor Guruswamy was more than just a professor; he was a vibrant character who enriched the lives of everyone he encountered. His flamboyance, charisma, and engaging conversation warmed our office hours. Even the most mundane tasks seemed less tedious when we could pop into the office room for a lively chat over a cup of tea. He was a master of the English language. Significant contributions of Prof Guruswamy have been made to the field of health system performance assessment - the World Health Survey. One of the proudest moments was when Professor Roy, as Director, entrusted him and his colleagues with overseeing this survey. Nearly two decades ago, IIPS embarked on a large-scale survey targeting the older adult and elderly population. His coedited book, "Population, Health and Development in India: Changing Perspectives," has garnered much appreciation. It's also worth noting the importance of his papers on public financing of health services. Under his leadership, the computer centre in IIPS experienced significant development. His punctual visits every morning ensured the smooth functioning of the operations.

I still remember his engaging conversations about his PhD experiences in Canberra and how his interactions with the esteemed Prof. Caldwell shaped his outlook and work in demography. The anecdotes he shared regarding Professor Caldwell's anthropological demographic research in South India, particularly around marriage, fertility, and contraception, were inspiring. I vividly remember his computer classes. Many of us were computer novices, more interested in hands-on learning than his overhead projector presentations. Professor Guruswamy understood this perfectly. He skilfully interwove his lectures with engaging conversations, encouraging us to learn from our experienced peers. His ability to create a comfortable atmosphere amid academic life's pressures made the experience much more enjoyable.

He was a tidy man, always noticing and commenting on the attire and appearance of his colleagues. I recall a humorous incident where he gently but firmly corrected a colleague about the importance of daily shaving – a story that my friend Manoj and I still chuckle about years later. His morning greetings became a cherished tradition, a testament to his warmth and approachability. Even after retirement, he continued driving from Bangalore to IIPS.

Our Diwali and New Year phone calls were filled with lengthy, heartwarming chats. His ability to connect with people on a personal level was honestly remarkable. My husband, too, enjoyed lively interactions with him, a testament to his ability to build strong relationships.

Prof. Guruswamy's memory is a treasure. I miss those conversations, those moments of laughter that filled my heart. Let us cherish our memories of him and continue to honour the vibrant spirit he brought into our lives.

A Memorial Tribute of Friend

Dr. B. S. Singh joined the Certificate in Population Studies (CPS) course at the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai, in 1986. After obtaining his PhD he he served IIPS as a Research Assistant. He stayed in an IIPS staff quarter, Nerul, New Mumbai, from 1988-1995. in

Dr. B.S. Singh's carrier has more than 30 years of research and teaching experience in the field of population and public health. After completing PhD in Population Studies from the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai, under the supervision of Prof K. B. Pathak, he was associated with various population and health projects in IIPS, including the National Family Health Survey-NFHS (1992-93). He also completed a Certificate Course in Planning and Management Information Systems from Management Sciences for Health (MSH), Boston, Massachusetts, USA. From 1995 to 2004, He worked with SIFPSA Lucknow (USAID supported Innovations in Family Planning Services Project) as a Deputy General Manager to support the development and monitoring of reproductive and child health programs. During this period, Dr Singh evaluated more than 200 projects under his leadership involving external agencies and contributed significantly to establishing and maintaining the IFPS project MIS. For a very short period, he was also associated with TNS India, Deepak Foundation, Vadodara Gujarat, and MAMTA-Health Institute for Mother & Child, New Delhi. From October 2010 to September 2013, he worked as Project Director in the Indian Institute of Health Management Research (IIHMR), Jaipur, for the Health of the Urban Poor (HUP) project, supported by USAID/India. He was an

Associate Professor in IIHMR Delhi from 2013 till his last breath. During his career, he was involved in more than 225 Research & Evaluation Projects in the area of public health as a lead person. In addition to several research publications in peer-reviewed journals, he published a book, *Methods for Estimating Demographic Parameters at Sub-National Level*.

Dr Singh had an amazing personality and thought processes were oriented towards the applied field and program implementation rather than a mere academic exercise. His exposure to the health program and academics made him a strong advocate for improving public health systems delivery at the grassroots level. He always motivated students for applied and meaningful research and was friendly among the students and colleagues. Dr. Singh was a person of very strong willpower and confidence. He was a genuine human being who always supported people around him, even if he had to go out of his way. In addition to being a hard-working person, he was very courageous and never afraid of taking tough decisions. Dr. Singh was a man who lived life on his own terms and conditions. Even in difficult situations, he was calm and knew how to get things done best. Dr Singh will always be remembered for his critical thinking, practical approach, kind-heartedness, and support for fellow beings.


Prof. Pradeep Mishra 05.02.1958 to 30.10.2024
