International Institute for Population Sciences, established in 1956 as a demographic training centre and subsequently declared as a 'Deemed to be University' in 1985, has grown over the period as a research-intensive university with over 500 students pursuing graduate programs in the broader area of Population Sciences. The Institute has completed 68 years of its glorious existence and 39 years as a "Deemed to be University". I am happy to report on the activities of the Institute for the academic year 2024-25.

Since its inception in 1956, IIPS has been at the forefront of conducting training programs in Population Studies for trainees from various countries in Asia and the Pacific region. The program was initially funded by the UNESCAP and later by the UNFPA. Through a one-year program, the Institute offered a "Certificate in Population Studies (CPS)," which was later redesignated as "Diploma in Population Studies (DPS)." The institute has trained personnel from various countries in Asia and the Pacific region under this program, who occupy key positions in the fields of population, health, and development in government departments, universities, and international organisations. A list of students who have completed the different teaching programs of the Institute over the years and by country is presented in Tables A & B of Appendix 1.

In August 1985, IIPS was awarded the status of a Deemed University, and in 1986, the Institute started awarding its own Ph.D. degree in Population Studies. To date, the Institute has awarded Ph.D. degrees to 419 candidates, including 11 foreign candidates. In 1988-89, the Institute started a one-year degree course entitled "Master of Population Studies (MPS)". To date, the Institute has awarded the MPS degree to 878 students. The Institute introduced a Master's program through distance learning mode in 1994-95, and 496 students have been awarded degrees through distance learning to date. From the academic year 2002-03, the Institute started a Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) in Population Studies degree course, and to date, 637 students have been awarded the degree.

From the academic year 2009-10, IIPS has launched a two-year degree course, viz. M.A. / M.Sc. in Population Studies for undergraduate students desiring to pursue a graduate program in population studies. In the year 2013-14, the Institute introduced another two-year degree course, viz. Master of Science in Biostatistics and Epidemiology, which was later renamed as Master of Science in Biostatistics and Demography (MBD).

IIPS also awards a Diploma in Health Education Promotion (DHPE), a Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH), and a Post Graduate Diploma in Hospital Management (PGDHM). These courses are conducted by the National Institute of Public Health and Research, Mumbai, affiliated with IIPS. The one-year Diploma in Health Education (DHE) was initiated in August 1987 and later renamed the Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE) in 2001-02. So far, 710 students, including 28 foreign students, have been awarded DHPE. The PGDCH was started in 2006-07, and to date, 67 students have received diplomas.

The Institute's functions can be classified into the categories of teaching, training, research, consultative services, and documentation. The Institute has eight academic departments with well-qualified faculty members. The details of the teaching departments, Faculty members, and Group A officers are presented in Appendix II.

1. TEACHING PROGRAMMES

1. Regular Courses

During the academic year 2024-25, the Institute offered the following regular courses: (a) Doctor of Philosophy in Population Studies (PhD), (b) Master of Arts / Science in Population Studies (M.A/M.Sc.), (c) Master of Science in Biostatistics and Demography (MBD), (d) Master of Science in Survey Research and Data Analytics (MSD), (e) Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE), (f) Post Graduate Diploma in Community (PGDCHC) and (g) Post Graduate Diploma in Hospital Management (PGDHM). Apart from these programs, the Institute also offers an M.A. in Population Studies through distance learning and a postdoctoral fellowship program. The following table provides a summary of the courses offered, the number of students awarded diplomas/degrees, and the number of students enrolled during the academic year 2024-25.

i. Doctor of Philosophy in Population Studies (Ph.D.)

The Institute has well-qualified faculty to guide students admitted to the PhD program through a highly competitive process that involves their previous academic records, online entrance tests, and proposal writing, followed by a personal interview. This academic year, 41 students have completed all the requirements for the award of a Ph.D. degree. Appendix III-1 provides the list of successful candidates receiving the degree in this academic year for the award of the Ph.D. degree. A total of 209 students are pursuing a Ph.D. Of them, 63 are recipients of the Government of India Research Fellowship, 76 are recipients of the UGC Fellowship, seven are from the NFSC Fellowship, two are from the NF-DIS fellowship, one is from a dual degree program, one is from the MANF fellowship, four are from the NFOBC Fellowship and 48 students are without fellowship. 3 students have submitted their theses, and 34 students have presented their synopses. The details of the PhD students are presented in Appendix IV.

ii. Master of Arts/Science (M.A./M.Sc.) in Population Studies

The course is two years in duration. This academic year, 26 students qualified for the award of the degree. The list of students receiving the M.A./M.Sc. degree is given in Appendix III–2. The 23 students currently enrolled in the program (2024-26) are presented in Appendix IV.

iii. Master of Science in Biostatistics and Demography (MBD)

The course is of a two-year duration. This academic year, 23 qualified for the award of the degree. The list of students receiving MBD degrees for this academic year is given in Appendix III–3. The 22 students currently enrolled in the program (2024-26) are presented in Appendix IV.

2. DISTANCE LEARNING COURSES

The Institute has been recognised by the Distance Education Council for offering an M.A. in Population Studies through Distance Learning.

M.A. in Population Studies (Distance Learning)

On the recommendation of the University Grants Commission, the Institute has started an M.A. in Population Studies course from the academic year 2017-18. Earlier, it was known as the Masters of Population Studies (MPS). This year, 5 students have completed all the requirements for the award of an M.A. degree (Distance Learning). Appendix III–7 provides a list of successful candidates who received the degree in this academic year for the award of the M.A. (Distance Learning). Currently, 158 students are enrolled in this program.

3. DISSERTATION

The dissertation constitutes a crucial part of the institute's teaching programs, as it contributes significantly to the development of students' research potential. Towards the end of the course, all students enrolled in various courses at the Institute must prepare a dissertation under the guidance of a faculty supervisor. The students present their dissertations in a specially organised Student-Faculty Seminar. Appendix – V (Tables A, B, C, D, E) provides a list of dissertations presented by the students during the current academic year (2024-25).

ii. Silver Medal

IIPS Silver medals are awarded to students whose overall performance is ranked as the second best in the respective programme – M.A/M.Sc., MBD, DHPE, PGDCH, PGDHM and M.A. (Distance learning).

iii. Best Paper/Dissertation/Thesis

A student from MA/M.Sc. & MBD, whose Dissertation is rated as best, has been awarded the Best Dissertation Award. This award is based on the content of the Dissertation, presentation and defence skills of the student while presenting the paper at the **Student**– Faculty Seminar. A Ph.D. scholar is awarded the Dr. P. N. Mari Bhat Gold Medal, adjudged based on the quality of the thesis. This award has been instituted in memory of Prof. P.N. Mari Bhat by his family.

II. TRAINING PROGRAM

IIPS has a well-established Short-Term Training Program (STTP) Unit. The unit periodically organises training programs for professionals, teachers from universities/colleges, research scholars, NGOs, Government officials, and students from India and abroad. The training programs are usually of one to two weeks' duration, addressing contemporary and relevant themes related to population, health, development, methods of data collection, analysis of large survey data, application of statistical software, etc.

III. SYMPOSIUM, MEMORIAL LECTURES, SEMINARS, WORKSHOP & WEBINARS

1. Symposium

Symposium on the occasion of the International Day for Older Persons 2024



Centre for Ageing Studies, IIPS, organised a symposium on 1st October 2024 to observe the International Day for Older Persons. This year's theme is with Ageing Dignity: The Importance of Strengthening Care and Support Systems for Older Persons. Four eminent speakers with vast expertise and experience in elder care, training and policy deliberated interventions on various issues. Prof. T.V. Sekher, Head of the Centre for Ageing Studies, welcomed the gathering

and introduced the four speakers. **Prof. Hemkhothang Lhungdim**, Director (Addl. Charge), chaired the symposium and highlighted the contributions of ageing surveys like LASI and SAGE and the vast research undertaken by IIPS during the last two decades. About 35 PhD scholars of IIPS are working on various aspects of population ageing using primary and secondary data. The first speaker for the symposium, **Ms Meenakshi Menon** (founder of GenSxty Tribe), shared her experiences in establishing

this organisation and her own experiences in dealing with ageing issues. Dr. Prem Narasimhan (Geriatrician, Jaslok Hospital and Research Centre, Mumbai) presented current initiatives in providing geriatric care in hospitals, mainly focusing on mental health issues among elderly citizens. Dr. Anagha Tendulkar, a sociologist and the principal of Sophia College for Women, Mumbai, highlighted the various challenges older people face in India and discussed how young citizens can improve their dignity.



Lastly, **Ms Gargi Sandu** (Co-founder of Goodfellows) spoke about the initiatives undertaken by their startup to support older people, primarily through companionship and spending quality time with young volunteers. The speakers emphasised the changing societal scenarios and the need for innovative policy and voluntary interventions to address the growing needs of India's elderly population. The symposium was attended by about 200 participants, including faculty and students of IIPS. **Prof. R. Nagarajan**, Associate Head, Centre for Ageing Studies, proposed the vote of thanks.

WORLD POPULATION DAY SYMPOSIUM - 2024

"Women's Sexual and Reproductive Health and Reproductive Rights."

The World Population Day 2024 marks the 30th anniversary of the International Conference on



Population Development (ICPD) Program of Action. Central to the ICPD program of action is the recognition that women's sexual and reproductive health and rights are cornerstones of sustainable development. On this occasion, an event was organised by IIPS wherein Dr Shireen Jejeebhoy, Director of the Aksha Centre for Equity and Wellbeing and the President of the International Union for Scientific Study of Population (IUSSP), and Prof. (Dr) Deepak

Raut, Director-Professor, and Dean at the National Institute of Public Health Training and Research,

Mumbai, Maharashtra, graced the occasion as the Invited Guests of the event. This year, the theme for World Population Day was "Women's Sexual and Reproductive Health and Reproductive Rights." The event featured diverse lectures by the two renowned guests. The Publication Cell and Short-term training program organised the event, which was generously sponsored by The Centre of Demography of Gender. The event was introduced by Prof. U.S. Mishra,



while Prof. D A Nagdeve, the Director and Senior Professor (Addl. Charge) at IIPS, shared the inaugural remarks. We also recognised and expressed our sincere appreciation to our event sponsors, The Centre



of Demography of Gender, CDG. On behalf of CDG, Dr Reshmi R S, Assistant Professor, IIPS, introduced the Centre, briefly discussed the ongoing projects, and emphasised how the works of CDG align with Population Day's theme. This was followed by an introduction of the Guest Speakers by Prof. U.S. Mishra and an insightful address by Dr Shireen Jejeebhoy, where she discussed women's and girls' agency

in sexual and reproductive health matters. The topic of her lecture was "How much voice do girls and

young women exercise in sexual and reproductive health?". After that, Prof. (Dr) Deepak Raut delivered his lecture on demographic dividends in India during the era of the epidemiological transition, which was a pivotal topic given India's current age structure. The subject of his lecture was "Demographic Dividend in the Era of Epidemiological Transition in India". The event was concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Dr Srinivas Goli, Coordinator of STTP and Publication Cell.

Living Longer, Living Better: A Symposium on Longevity and Health

(Virtual Symposium)

The Centre for Ageing Studies at the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai, in collaboration with Rhenix LifeSciences, Hyderabad, successfully hosted a two-day virtual symposium titled "Living Longer, Living Better: A Symposium on Longevity and Health" on 20-21 September 2024. The event was co-organised by Prof. Dhananjay W. Bansod from IIPS, Mumbai, and Senior Scientist Dr. Shashaanka Ashili from Rhenix LifeSciences, Hyderabad.

The symposium gathered over 350 participants from 150 institutions worldwide, including leading experts, researchers, and policymakers. The discussions centred around critical issues facing ageing populations, focusing on themes such as graceful and sustainable ageing, elderly empowerment, and the impact of policies on ageing. Technological advancements, such as wearables and smart homes, were also explored as ways to promote healthy and fulfilling lives for older adults.

The symposium featured four major themes: Theme 1: Ageing, Health, and Well-being; Theme 2: Socioeconomic Status & Cultural Diversity in Ageing; Theme 3: Technological Innovations for Ageing; Theme 4: Healthcare Policies for the Elderly;

The event included four plenary and six technical sessions, with 18 guest speakers and 41 paper presenters (including faculty members and research scholars). Eminent speakers from various



organisations like Dr Sathyanarayana from UNFPA, DPRK; Dr Nikhil R. Gandasi from IISc Dr Bangalore; Κ. R. Gangadharan from Heritage Foundation India, Hyderabad; Dr Pawan Patro from the National University of Singapore; Dr Francois Pellay from Bimini Biotech, Croatia; Dr Anastasios Avranas from Interfima, Greece; Dr

Charu Monga from IIT Delhi; Prof. Mala Kapur Shankardass Retd. A professor from the University of Delhi, Prof. T.V. Sekher from IIPS; Prof. S. Siva Raju, former Director TISS, Hyderabad; Dr Mahesh Bhatt, MMBSHS Trust, Dehradun, etc., delivered their expertise in different domains of ageing and longevity, covering both social and medical dimensions.

A special highlight was the "Dr Harsh Chaturvedi Memorial (HCM) Student Award," which was presented to seven outstanding student presenters, recognising their contributions to the field of ageing research. The symposium was a remarkable platform for exchanging knowledge and advancing discussions on ensuring a healthy, empowered, and sustainable future for the ageing populations.

2. Memorial Lectures

23rd Prof. C. Chandrasekaran Memorial Lecture

International Institute for Population Sciences organised the 23rd Prof. C. Chandrasekaran Memorial Lecture on 20th February 2025. The Memorial Lecture Series is held annually in memory of Prof. C. Chandrasekaran, former Director of IIPS, a pioneer in Indian demography. Prof. Chandrasekaran



developed the well-known Chandra-Deming formula to provide better estimates of vital events, which is the backbone of the Sample Registration System in India that collects data on critical events. His contribution to society and academic organisations was prodigious. Dr Pratima Murthy, Director and Senior Professor of Psychiatry, National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS), Bengaluru, delivered

the lecture. As the Director of NIMHANS, Dr Murthy has undertaken several initiatives to improve patient care, establish newer facilities, expand training programmes, and further strengthen mental health and neurosciences research. She delivered a lecture on the topic **"Head counts or more?**

Addressing the Challenges in Mental Health Care", where she explained the importance of head counts, the global burden of mental health and the global epidemiology of mental disorders. She also discussed the Previous Mental Health Surveys, specifically the National Mental Health Survey (NMHS–1), 2015-16. She also informed us about the upcoming 2^{nd} Phase of the National Mental Health Survey (NMHS – 2), particularly the changes that have



been made in the study design and its more significant coverage of all States and UTs. Prof. U.S. Mishra, Coordinator of the Publication Cell, addressed the session, and Prof. R. Nagarajan, Department of Population and Development, spoke briefly about Prof. C. Chandrasekaran and his contributions. The session was chaired by Prof. D. A. Nagdeve, Director & Senior Professor (Addl. charge), IIPS, and was attended by approximately. 250 participants. Ms Madhurima Sharma, PhD Student, gave the formal vote of thanks.

17th Prof. P. N. Mari Bhat Memorial Lecture

International Institute for Population Sciences organised the 17th Prof. P.N. Mari Bhat Memorial Lecture on 27th February 2025. The Memorial Lecture series is held annually in memory of Prof. P. N. Mari



Bhat, former Director of IIPS. Prof. Abhiroop Mukhopadhyay, Professor, Economics and Planning Unit, Indian Statistical Institute – Delhi Centre and an expert with extensive research knowledge in the field of education and health in the context of India, delivered the lecture on the topic "The 'New' Human Capital to Leverage the Demographic Dividend of

India". The talk sheds light on how India's demographic dividend has yielded from the skills aspect of the labour force - Human Capital. He tried to give answers to the question, "Are these skills important, and can they be taught at scale in India?" through this lecture. Prof. U.S. Mishra, Coordinator of the Publication Cell, addressed the session, and Prof. T. V. Sekher spoke briefly about Prof. P.N. Mari Bhat and his contributions. The session was chaired by Prof. D. A. Nagdeve, Director & Senior Professor (Addl. charge), IIPS and was attended by approx. 250 participants. 14th Prof. Asha A. Bhende Memorial Lecture

International Institute for Population Sciences organised the 14th Prof. Asha A. Bhende Memorial



Lecture on 1st April 2025. Dr Kalpana Apte, Director General, Family Planning Association of India (FPA India), Mumbai, well known as a development professional in Public Health. particularly Sexual & Reproductive Health and Rights and Family Planning in India, delivered the lecture. The Prof. Asha A. Bhende Memorial Lecture has been instituted at

IIPS in memory of Prof. Bhende, a former Professor of the institute and a well-known demographer, health researcher and gender expert. Every year, eminent scholars in the fields of population, health, and gender are invited to deliver Prof. Bhende's Memorial Lecture. Dr Kalpana Apte discussed the topic **"Adolescent Sexual and Reproductive Health & Rights in a Resurgent India: Opportunities and Challenges".** She talked about Sexual and Reproductive Health & Rights among adolescent persons in India. She also discussed the challenges that adolescents usually face when they try to use their

reproductive health rights. 3. Seminars

IIPS National Seminar 2025 "India's Evolving Demographics: Challenges and Implications for Human Development"

Recognising the significance of the evolving demographic landscape, the 29th IIPS National Seminar,



organised by the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai, brought together leading experts, researchers, and policymakers to explore the theme, "India's Evolving Demographics: Challenges and Implications for Human Development". The seminar was held between March 19th and 20th at the Lagoona Resort, Lonavala, providing a

platform for insightful discussions on the demographic shifts shaping India's future. This event was organised around eight different themes, comprising 32 technical papers, in addition to which the

doctoral students' participation was in terms of displaying 24 selected posters representing reputed institutions like IITs and IIMs. The notable individuals gracing the Inaugural event of this seminar included the former chief secretary of Maharashtra State, Mr J P Dange, D. Sheela Godbole, Director of the ICMR-National Institute of Translational Virology and AIDS



Research, Pune, along with a virtual address by the current chief secretary of the Maharashtra state Mrs Sujata Saunik. The two-day event's valedictory address was delivered by. Dr Kalpana Apte, the Director General (CEO) of the Family Planning Association of India, along with a special address by Prof. Deepak Raut, the Medical Superintendent and Professor of Preventive and Social Medicine at MGM, Vashi, Mumbai. The two plenary sessions held during the two days of the seminar highlighted the interconnections between demographic transitions, health systems, economic dynamics, and policy reforms in India. The discussions centred around a **holistic, inclusive approach** that recognises the complexity of population health and well-being. By fostering **equitable, sustainable, and forward-looking policies**, India can navigate its demographic transitions while ensuring a healthier, more inclusive future for all its citizens.

The discussions and deliberations during the seminar have equivocally conveyed the role of demographics in reading about human welfare and well-being. The dynamic shifts in population structures—whether through fertility patterns, reproductive health trends, or the impacts of

environmental vulnerabilities-offer critical insights into the evolving needs and challenges of societies. Α demographic lens is indispensable for understanding regional differences, interpreting the nuances of social behaviours, and assessing the progress of health, education, and economic development. For instance, the session on family planning underscored how influence demographic shifts



perceptions and access to reproductive health services, revealing the gap between policy advances and on-the-ground realities. Similarly, the discussion on social support and fertility highlighted how demographic factors intertwine with cultural and social norms to shape reproductive decisions.

Moreover, the intersection of demographics with health vulnerabilities, as seen in the EAG states and the effects of climatic risks, illustrates how population dynamics can amplify or mitigate health outcomes. In this context, the importance of integrating demographic insights into sectors like education, employment, and longevity becomes evident. The outlooks emerging from these areas require not just statistical analysis but sensitisation to demographic trends to inform effective policies and interventions.

The talk was designed for an audience with introductory knowledge of statistics and highlighted both the advantages and the complexities of adaptive designs in clinical trials.

The talk was organised by Prof. Udaya Shankar Mishra and Dr. Srinivas Goli, coordinators for the Publication Cell and Short-Term Training Program. The session was chaired by Prof. D. A. Nagdeve, Director and Senior Professor (Additional Charge) at the International Institute for Population Sciences.

Invited Talk on "Qualitative Comparative Analysis"

Prof. Miguel San Sebastian, a Professor in Public Health at the Department of Epidemiology and Global Health, Umeå University, Sweden, delivered a brief talk on Qualitative Comparative Analysis (QCA). In this insightful and gripping talk, he introduced Qualitative Comparative Analysis (QCA) as a method



for identifying patterns across cases in complex data sets. The presenter highlighted that the tool enables researchers explore how to different factor combinations lead to similar or different outcomes. This approach involving Fuzzy Set Qualitative Comparative Analysis (fsQCA) enhances the understanding of complex causal relationships by accommodating degrees of membership, thus providing a more nuanced analysis

compared to traditional binary methods. The presenter also shared examples of the application of QCA by researchers to demonstrate its usefulness in public health research. This one-hour lecture was followed by an engaging Q&A session.

Prof. Miguel was in IIPS as part of the collaborative meeting of the ICMR-FORTE funded project titled "The cognitive consequences of social frailty: a mixed methods study of precarity and resilience among ageing populations in India and Sweden". Prof TV Sekher chaired the session.

5. Workshops

Three-Day Workshop on "United States Census Data: An Exploration Using the Integrated Public Use Micro Data Series (IPUMS)"



The Publication Cell and Short-term Training Program, International Institute for Population Sciences, Mumbai, conducted a workshop on "United States Census Data: An Exploration Using the Integrated Public Use Micro Data Series (IPUMS)" from 2nd – 4th January 2025. Prof. D. A. Nagdeve, Director and Senior Professor (Additional Charge), was the patron of the workshop. Prof. U. S. Mishra and Dr Srinivas Goli were the coordinators of the workshop. Dr

Veena Kulkarni, Associate Professor, Arkansas State University, USA, was the resource person. The workshop was attended by Research Students, Academicians, and Professionals from diverse fields of engagement. The workshop equipped the participants with the ability to use the Integrated Public Use Micro Data Series (IPUMS) for migration-related studies.

Five-Days Hands-On Training Workshop on SAS Programming



A comprehensive five-day workshop was conducted on March 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, and 10th, 2025, to provide handson training in SAS programming for data analysis, focusing on key areas such as data analysis, reporting, and clinical programming. The training program was organised by the Information Communication and Technology Unit and held at the BIG LAB of the ICT Unit. Corporate trainers from SAS Institute (I) Pvt Ltd., Mr Akshay Dixit, conducted sessions on SAS programming and SAS Viya, while Ms Kamakshi Hans led sessions on clinical programming.

Participants were introduced to the foundational concepts of SAS programming, including syntax, data manipulation, and data handling techniques. The sessions also covered the use of the SAS Enterprise

Guide for querying data and generating reports, as well as an introduction to SAS Viya, a cloud-based platform for large-scale data processing. Practical sessions focused on building and deploying machine learning models using SAS Viya, followed by a session on clinical programming for clinical data analysis and regulatory reporting.

The workshop was attended by a diverse group of faculty and students, with selection based on the order of registration, prioritising PhD students, followed by MBD and MSD students. The workshop was highly successful, providing participants with valuable skills in SAS tools for statistical analysis, machine learning, reporting, and clinical programming, which will enhance their research and professional work in data analytics.

Half-day Training Session on "Accessing Census Micro Data for the Workstation Users"

The Information Communication and Technology (ICT) Unit organised a half-day training session on



'Accessing Census Micro Data for Workstation Users' jointly conducted by IIPS and the Directorate of Census Operations (DCO), Maharashtra, on July 3rd, 2024. The session, held at the ICT Unit Lab, was attended by 42 researchers, including faculty and PhD students of IIPS.

DCO officials Shri Sagar Bagul, ADCO(T), Shri Pravin N. Bhagat, ADCO(T), and Shri Tushar Patil,

SI Gr-II, delivered lectures on crucial topics, including the structure and variables of census micro-data files. Participants were educated on maintaining confidentiality and complying with legal regulations when utilising census micro-data. The session also detailed the process for obtaining necessary approvals to access and use this data.

IV. PROJECT RELATED ACTIVITIES

National Family Health Survey 2023-24 (NFHS-6)

The sixth round of the National Family Health Survey 2023-24 (NFHS-6) is ongoing. Like its predecessors, NFHS-6 is being conducted under the stewardship of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. NFHS-6 is the first in the series of NFHS in India, which is being conducted without technical and financial assistance from any external agency. For the first time, in NFHS-6, all aspects of the survey will be coordinated solely by the International Institute for Population Sciences, Mumbai. Data collection is implemented by a group of survey organisations and Population Research Centres.

Like in NFHS-5, NFHS-6 will provide estimates of the levels of fertility, infant and child mortality, and other family welfare and health indicators by background characteristics at the national and district levels and measure trends in family welfare and health indicators over time at the national and district levels.

In addition, the scope of NFHS-6 has been expanded further to help track the progress of policies and programmes in the context of SDG goals to be achieved by 2023, to align with global indicators and to

relate to emerging issues of health and well-being of people at national and subnational levels. In NFHS-6, new questions have been added with the aim of providing accurate data for research purposes and also enabling the evaluation of various policies/programmes of different programme divisions. This is also useful for advocacy and awareness at national and sub-national levels.

Some salient features of NFHS-6 are -

- In addition to the 28 states, NFHS-6 will also cover all 8 Union Territories (UTs). Similarly, NFHS-6 will provide estimates of most indicators at the district level for all 731 districts in the country as of June 30, 2021.
- The NFHS-6 sample size is expected to be approximately 670,000 households (in all 731 districts). As the survey will elicit information (using Household, Woman's, Man's, and Biomarker Questionnaires) from all women aged 15-49 and men aged 15-54 in a subsample of households, it is estimated that NFHS-6 will yield a total sample of 750,000 women age 15-49 years, and 120,000 men age 15-54 years. In these households, information about 250,000 children below age 5 will also be collected in the survey.
- For the first time, the Mapping and Household Listing operation is done in the digital mode using mini laptops and the automation of household sample selection. Also, the main survey data is collected using Computer Assisted Personal Interviewing (CAPI) on mini-notebook computers. The use of CAPI has several advantages and thereby ensures better data quality.
- Height and weight measurements for women aged 15-49, men aged 15-54, and children aged under 5 years are included in NFHS-6. All related estimates will be provided at the district level.
- Like in NFHS-5, other components included in the domain of clinical, anthropometric and biochemical testing (CAB) in NFHS-6 are blood glucose and blood pressure measurements, with estimates to be provided at the district level. In addition, NFHS-6 will be collecting finger-stick blood to produce dried blood spots (DBS) from a subsample of respondents for laboratory testing of HIV, Hepatitis B, and Hepatitis C. These tests will provide an opportunity to estimate the community-based burden of HIV, Hepatitis-B and Hepatitis-C at the national and state/union territory (UT) levels. For the first time, DBS will also be collected from children aged 4-5 to check for the prevalence of Hepatitis B.
- Multiple strategies are adopted to ensure the reliability and validity of data. Some such measures are standardised tools and survey implementation protocols as per international standards, nested design using a modular approach, digitisation of data collection procedures, real-time data access in the form of field check tables to provide timely feedback, making available digital reports like POQR for effective field monitoring, secondary editing messages help resolve data related issues/ inconsistencies in the field, etc. Additionally, on completion of about 70 per cent of fieldwork in a district, the IIPS field team, along with the FA core team, conducts back checks in 3-4 PSUs to assess the data quality and, based on the data quality report submitted by the back check team, necessary action is taken.

Key NFHS-6 activities accomplished:

The main survey data collection in Phase I, states/groups of states/UTs, has been successfully completed in all the states except Manipur, where the survey could not be started due to the state's situation. Subsequently, the data processing activities for Phase I states/UTs were taken up, and upon completion, the first draft of the fact sheets of key indicators for these states was generated, reviewed and finalised.



The state-level training and fieldwork were conducted in the Phase II states/groups of states/UTs, and the main survey fieldwork in these states/UTs was completed in December Currently, the data 2024. processing activities for Phase II states/UTs are underway, and the first draft of fact sheets for these states will be ready in the coming months. Also, data analysis for generating tables for Phase I states/UTs as per the draft NFHS-6 tabulation plan has been initiated.

The fifth TAC meeting was held on 23 December 2024 to discuss the current state of NFHS-6 field activities.

The results presented in the first draft of NHFS-6 fact sheets for Phase I states/UTs were reviewed. Also, the key indicators to be included in the NFHS-6 national/state/district fact sheets were finalised. NFHS-6 PIs had a meeting at the Ministry in Delhi on 27 January 2025 to present the provisional results of the NFHS-6 fact sheet key indicators for Phase I states/UTs.

The new NFHS website was inaugurated by Shri Kal Singh, DG, MoHFW (Stats.) on 19 September 2024 in the presence of Smt. Reena Singh, CD, MoHFW (Stats.), Shri Amrit Lal Jangid, Director,



MoHFW (Stats.), Shri. Deepak Kumar, Jt. Director, MoHFW (Stats.), NFHS-6 PIs and office team. All available publications and datasets of the various rounds of the NFHS survey can be accessed through this website. The new website has upgraded user-friendly features, where users have to log in to download the files. The NFHS-6 training for DBS logging, cataloguing, and HIV testing using INCHTTS Software was conducted for the laboratories from 19-20 September 2024, held at ICMR_NITVAR, Pune. All the regional labs have procured the required lab equipment, and preparations to commence testing of DBS samples are ongoing. The details of the samples, like state/district/PSU/HI codes, quality of DBS, etc., for both Phase I and Phase II states have been checked for any inconsistency at IIPS. The samples are being logged into the INTHTTS software in the regional labs. The test run of the testing component of the INTHTTS software was held at the lab located in Mumbai (JJ Hospital) on 20-21 February 2025 by

the IIPS IT/CAB team. After the required revisions, the updated software will be deployed in all the regional labs and testing work will commence.

Work related to the generation of APIs and the NFHS dashboard is nearing completion. This work is being carried out by the CDAC team in consultation with the IIPS NFHS-6 team. Several meetings were held to review the progress, and revisions as required were conveyed. The changes are being implemented by the team as per the



suggestions received, and the updated version will be ready for launch in the coming months.

Longitudinal Ageing Study in India (LASI), Wave 2

3rd Meeting of Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) of Longitudinal Ageing Study in India (LASI) Wave-2

The 3rd meeting of the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) of Longitudinal Ageing Study in India (LASI) Wave 2 was held on January 17th, 2025, at IIPS. The TAC meeting was chaired by Prof. Sulabha



Parsuraman and co-chaired by Prof. S. Siva Raju. Shri. Kal Singh, Director General (Stat.) and Ms Reena Singh, Chief Director (Stat.), MoHFW, highlighted the importance of LASI for policy making and program monitoring and also emphasised the commitment of the government to continue LASI. The expert members of the TAC- Prof. A. B. Dey, Prof. S. Irudaya Rajan, Prof. M. H. Suryanarayana, Prof. Mathew

Verghese, Shri. Mathew Cherian and Dr. Mala Kapur Shankardass attended the meeting. Representatives from ICMR, WHO, UNFPA, NCD (NPHCE), NARI, NCDIR-ICMR, MoSJE, and DGHS also attended the meeting, along with LASI Project Coordinators. Prof. D.A. Nagdeve, Director

& Senior Professor (Addl. Charge), IIPS, welcomed the TAC members. A two-minute silence was observed in honour of Prof. Arvind Pandey, former chairperson of the TAC, who passed away last year.

Prof. T.V. Sekher, PI-LASI, presented a summary of activities undertaken so far for the Wave 2 survey. The key topics discussed were the survey instruments and the methodology for wave 2. The Wave 1



respondents (73,000) will be interviewed in Wave 2, and in addition, if any age-eligible individuals are available in the same households, they will also be included. The biomarkers (including DBS) conducted in Wave 1 will also be done in Wave 2. The meeting brought together experts, practitioners, and ministry officials, who shared valuable insights to propel the

project forward, ensuring impactful research on health and ageing in India. The Wave 2 survey will be initiated soon. The International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) officially received the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for implementing the LASI Wave-2 survey from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), Govt of India.

Global Adult Tobacco Survey-3 (GATS-3)

Pre-test of Survey Tools

The International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai, has conducted the Pre-test of survey tools for the Global Adult Tobacco Survey-3 (GATS-3) at the U Rivergate Resort, Karjat, Maharashtra,



and Android tablets during the 3-day classroom session.

from March 17 to 22, 2025. Prof. D.A. Nagdeve, Director & Senior Professor (Addl. charge), IIPS Mumbai, inaugurated the event. bringing investigators and supervisors together for comprehensive training on survey methodologies and data collection procedures. The training sessions were led by GATS-3 Principal Investigators (PIs), including Prof. R. Nagarajan, Prof. Nandita Saikia, Dr Dilip T. R., Dr Manas Ranjan Pradhan, and Dr Pradeep S. Salve. Participants were trained to familiarise themselves with the survey tools, ethical considerations, and data collection techniques using both pen-and-paper

Field data collection was carried out by four teams (1 team consisting of 2 male and 2 female investigators and 1 Supervisor). Field data collection was carried out from March 20 to 22, 2025, in non-sampled PSUs of rural areas of Neral Gram Panchayat and urban areas of Karjat Municipality. The field activities were systematically monitored, and daily review meetings were held to address any operational challenges, flow of the questions, skip patterns, software, assess progress, and maintain data quality. The pretest concluded with a debriefing session, during which field challenges, investigator experiences, and feedback were discussed in detail. The insights gained from this pretest will play a crucial role in refining the main survey implementation, ensuring a smooth and effective nationwide rollout of GATS-3.

Dissemination of Exemplars in Maternal and Newborn Health India Study, Maharashtra



On September 27, 2024, IIPS hosted the dissemination of the Maharashtra State Report on Maternal and Newborn Health at The Fern Residency, Mumbai. In collaboration with the NHSRC, IHAT, and the University of Manitoba, gathered we key health officials and experts to discuss significant maternal and neonatal health

advancements across Maharashtra. The report was released by esteemed leaders, including Dr Nitin Ambadekar, Additional Director of Health Services, Government of Maharashtra; Dr K. Madan Gopal, Advisor, PHA, NHSRC, Government of India; Dr Babita Kamlapurkar, Joint Director, Family Welfare, Government of Maharashtra; and Dr Hemkhothang Lhungdim, Director (Addl. Charge) at IIPS, along with other Maharashtra Government officials.



The inaugural session featured insightful presentations by Dr Manoj Alagarajan, Associate Professor at IIPS; Dr Ravi Prakash, Director of M&E and Research; Dr Usha Ram, Research & Technical Specialist (IGPH-UoM); and Dr Shajy, Managing Trustee of IHAT, showcasing crucial improvements in maternal and newborn care services in the state. Exemplars in Maternal and Newborn Health Study, Madhya Pradesh Dissemination Workshop, July 5, 2024

On July 5, 2024, the Exemplars in Maternal and Newborn Health (MNH) Study team at the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) organised a significant dissemination

event for the Madhya Pradesh State Report at The Marriott Hotel in Bhopal. This event was held in collaboration with the India Health Action Trust (IHAT), the National Health Systems Resource Centre (NHSRC), and the University of Manitoba (UoM). The Project Investigators (PIs) included from IIPS Prof. Laxmi Kant Dwivedi, Dr. Manoj Alagarajan, and Dr.

Guru Vasishtha. Additionally, Dr. B. M. Ramesh from the University of Manitoba and Dr. Shajy Isac from IHAT, who were PIs from outside IIPS, played key roles in ensuring the smooth conduct of the dissemination event in Madhya Pradesh. The event brought together key stakeholders from state and district health departments to review the study's findings and discuss their implications for improving maternal and newborn health in Madhya Pradesh.

The event commenced with the release of the Madhya Pradesh State Report. Ms Priyanka Das,

IAS, Mission Director of the National Health Mission (NHM) in Madhya Pradesh, along with Dr Dewaram A. Nagdeve, Director (Additional Charge) at IIPS, and other dignitaries, officially launched the report. Dr. Dewaram A. Nagdeve presented the state's perspective on the MNH Exemplar Study, followed by Dr. K. Madan Gopal, who highlighted the global perspective on maternal and newborn health. In her keynote address, Ms Priyanka Das emphasised the need for Madhya Pradesh to sustain its efforts to improve healthcare while learning from states like Tamil Nadu, which has successfully reduced maternal mortality to below the national average.

Following this, a technical session featured presentations from project experts, including Prof. Laxmi Kant Dwivedi (IIPS, Mumbai), Dr Ravi Prakash (University of Manitoba & IHAT), Dr Usha Ram (University of Manitoba), and Dr Shajy K. Isac (IHAT). Their presentations underscored significant improvements in maternal and newborn care services, contributing to reductions in maternal and neonatal mortality within the state. Prof. Laxmi Kant Dwivedi highlighted the decrease in health equity gaps of MNH indicators in Madhya Pradesh and reductions in the causes of neonatal mortality over the past 25 years in the state.

A panel discussion was also held, emphasising the importance of data-driven governance and improving healthcare delivery, particularly in rural areas. This session was chaired by Dr. K. Madan Gopal and included panellists comprising medical, academic, and social sciences experts. While acknowledging Madhya Pradesh's progress in maternal and newborn health, panellists stressed the need for sustained efforts to enhance health outcomes further.

This dissemination event marked a crucial step in advancing maternal and newborn health in Madhya Pradesh, showcasing the commitment of stakeholders to leverage data for informed decision-making and effective healthcare interventions. The state must prioritise both macro and micro-level interventions. Primary care facilities should be equipped and trained to deliver services at the macro level. Meanwhile, higher-level facilities, including CEmONC centres, should be prepared to offer macro and micro-level services, emphasising tracking and managing complications. The state can substantially progress in MNH outcomes by improving macro-level health systems and micro-level community engagement.

The session aimed to ensure accuracy and consistency in the transcription and translation process to maintain the integrity of qualitative data collected from the field. The participants were provided with an audio file of FGD data beforehand, allowing them to review and share their critical observations

during the session. This hands-on approach enabled a more interactive and practical learning experience. The session emphasised the importance of maintaining clarity, cultural context and precision in capturing the voice and nuances of the discussions, ensuring that the transcripts and translations are authentic and reliable for further analysis.

V. THE PUBLICATION CELL

IIPS has a well-established Publication Cell Unit that looks after the publication of Newsletters, Research Briefs, and Working Paper series from faculty members and other subject experts/scholars. Prof U. S. Mishra and Dr. Srinivas Goli are the Coordinators of the Publication Cell.

1. Publications of the Institute:

The IIPS Newsletter provides information about various ongoing activities of the institute. Two issues of the IIPS Newsletter were published during the academic year 2024-25. The publication of the "Research Brief Series" was started in 2007 to provide an opportunity for the faculty, PhD students and visiting fellows to quickly disseminate the important findings of their research studies before being published as research reports or in a scientific journal. So far, 23 research briefs have been published under this series. The 'Working Paper Series' was started in 2009-10 with the objective of disseminating new research ideas, theoretical development and methodological insights. The papers published in this series are peer-reviewed by two external experts working in the areas of population, health, and development. So far, 27 Working papers have been published.

2. Publications of the Faculty:

The members of the faculty, along with research staff/ students, published several research papers in reputed journals and prepared a number of project reports during the years 2024-25. The number of books, Research Papers, Articles, chapters in Books, Published Research Reports, Monographs, Research Briefs, and Fact sheets of IIPS Faculty, along with Research Staff published during the year 2024-25, is given in the table below, along with the details in the appendix.

X. CENTRE FOR DISTANCE AND ONLINE EDUCATION (CDOE)

Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA) Meeting on 19th November 2024



A meeting of the Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA) for distance education was held on 19th November 2024 in the Guest House Dining Hall of the Institute. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the various aspects of internal quality assurance related to the Open and Distance Learning (ODL) program under the Centre for

Distance and Online Education (CDOE) at the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS). Prof. Hemkhothang Lhungdim chaired the meeting.

Eleven members attended the meeting to discuss various issues related to the distance education program with the two external experts, Prof Dhaneswar Harichandran, Retired Prof, Mumbai University and Dr Vaibhav Jadhav, Pune University.

XI. CENTRE OF DEMOGRAPHY OF GENDER

The International Institute for Population Sciences launched the 'Centre of Demography of Gender' within the Department of Population and Development on October 01, 2021. The new centre aims to carry out high-quality, interdisciplinary teaching and empirical research on various aspects related to population, health, and development in India and abroad. A key mandate of the new centre is to develop a gender-related course curriculum that suits the requirements of various stakeholders. Capacity

building through tailor-made short-term courses. The new centre will act as a central data repository in India from where individuals, institutions or other stakeholders can access all data related to issues on gender. It will also provide timely policy inputs to the central and state governments and local administrative bodies for the formulation of appropriate policies and programmes from time to time.

Financial Assistance to the Students

Twelve students have been awarded travel grants to present their research work on gender issues at the following international platforms:

All those researchers have been selected based on their research potential to contribute valuable insights exclusively in the field of gender studies. The international platforms have provided them with a great opportunity to share their findings and engage with experts from around the world. Many more students have been selected for the grant to share their research findings in the upcoming conferences scheduled for 2025.

XII. LIBRARY

The library at the International Institute for Population Sciences offers a wide range of resources to support the educational, learning, and research needs of our institution. We have about 88,040 books, 19,531 bound periodicals, 17,214 reprints, and 642 audio-visual materials, and we subscribe to over 320 journals (Print + online). We receive 17 newspapers daily. There are 29,590 research articles from the core journals and edited books indexed and made available through the Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). The library has a comprehensive collection focusing on population studies and its main areas. We additionally cover various other subjects like philosophy, psychology, religion, sociology, statistics, economics, education, math, anthropology, public health, history, geography, etc. The library has a special collection of census volumes published in the pre-independence period (Census of India 1872 to 1941 in PDF format), till the latest Census 2011. In addition to providing access to physical resources, we offer a range of information services such as Current Awareness, New Additions, Selective Dissemination of Information, Document Delivery Service, Photocopy facilities, Reference Service, Bibliographic service, metadata interpolation and so on.

The library has access to some of the best e-resources and databases like JSTOR, SCIENCE DIRECT (social science collection), SCOPUS, INDIASTAT, CMIE Database, NEJM, UN Database, and other leading publishers' online collections relevant to health and population sciences. The library provides remote access through iProx21 to the IIPS repository and more than 2,000+ online (full-text) journals to authorised users.

The IIPS library has an institutional membership with INFLIBNET, DELNET, IASLIC, NIRD, IASSI, etc. and explores maximum services for the benefit of the Institute. The Institute is an active member of INFLIBNET-Shodhganga. To ensure research integrity, the library can access the Drill Bit Software for Plagiarism checking. The library also conducts a user orientation program and provides online referral services. The library provides an RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) facility for the issue/return of books, journals, and reprints to library users. The library has a reading hall with a seating capacity of 100+ individuals equipped with comfortable furniture, study carrels, centralised air conditioning, and a Wi-Fi facility. The library's working hours are 8.30 a.m. to 12.00 a.m. (Mon-Fri) and 9.30 a.m. to 12.00 a.m. on Saturdays.

Dr. K. Praveen Kumar is the library and information officer.

XIII. INFORMATION COMMUNICATION AND TECHNOLOGY UNIT

The Information Communication and Technology (ICT) Unit provides effective and developmental ICT services and plays a critical role in enabling the Institute to deliver high-quality education, training, and cutting-edge research. Under the National Knowledge Network project, the Institute has acquired a 1-Gbps internet link from the NIC. The ICT Unit has two computer labs equipped with 48 and 10 high-configuration computers and modern audio-visual devices. Moreover, necessary statistical and demographic software, such as IBM SPSS Version 29, STATA Version 16, SAS 9.4, and ArcGIS 10.7.1, NVIVO, required to analyse demographic datasets, are installed with multiuser licenses. The other important software is MORTPAK, Spectrum, EndNote X7, and ATLAS.ti.

The ICT division creates, maintains, and updates information on the Institute's website & Social media accounts regularly. The unit provides webmail service, enabling remote access to its users and provides technical support to the e-Governance (e-Office) application.

The Institute uses ICT services like video conferencing and learning management systems to deliver online courses, provide access to course materials, and disseminate large demographic datasets.

The Data Centre at IIPS has all relevant demographic datasets, such as census and various rounds of large-scale surveys conducted by IIPS, which can be directly accessed by IIPS users locally. Through a web portal https://www.iipsdata.ac.in, online databases of surveys conducted by IIPS are also disseminated to the registered users.

The Institute inaugurated a new Census Data Workstation on December 12, 2023. The Census Data Research Workstation is a state-of-the-art facility designed to facilitate access to India's Census Microdata for academicians and researchers.

Prof. Chander Shekhar is the In-charge of the ICT Unit, and Mr. A.K. Mishra is the System Manager.

XIV. PLACEMENT CELL

The placement cell is actively enhancing the placement opportunities for students graduating from IIPS. Students undergoing each course at IIPS nominate two representatives to the placement cell. Under the direction of the two placement cell coordinators (Dr Dilip T. R. and Dr Manas Ranjan Pradhan), the placement officer and twenty student representatives organise and carry out the placement cell's activities. In 2024–2025, the placement cell held eight training sessions and pre-placement events. This year, IDFC First Bank, The Antara Foundation, and MAGIC BUS Foundation extended campus placement offers to IIPS students and conducted interviews for the process by Pfizer Health Care.

XV. SOCIAL MEDIA CELL

XVI. HOSTEL FACILITY

The teaching and training programmes at the Institute are mostly residential. The Institute has two hostels. All the rooms are self-contained, well-furnished and have adequate living and working space. Three VIP rooms are available in the Guest House, with a furnished Kitchen and Dining room. There is a hostel mess run on a no-loss, no-profit basis by a committee consisting of student representatives, hostel staff and the hostel warden. LCD televisions are also provided exclusively for students' use in both hostels. Indoor and outdoor game facilities and a gymnasium are also available.

Orientation Program on Anti-Ragging for 1st Year Hostel Resident Students

XVII. INTERNAL COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES

1. Event 1: First Orientation Program on July 11, 2024

The Internal Committee of IIPS Mumbai organised an orientation program on July 11, 2024, for secondyear MA/MSc and MBD students, aiming to educate them about the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) Act 2013, Vishakha guidelines, and prevention of sexual harassment at the workplace. The



program featured presentations by Internal Committee members and the medical counsellor, covering critical topics such as sexual harassment, Vishakha guidelines, internal committee procedures, complaint registration, and the link between mental health and sexual harassment. 2. Event 2: Second Orientation Program on August 12, 2024

The Internal Committee (IC) of the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) conducted a successful orientation program on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment against Women and Students at the Workplace (POSH) Act, 2013, on August 12, 2024. The program, attended by 150 participants,

XVIII. INSTITUTIONAL REVIEW BOARD

The International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai, being a premier teaching, training and research Institute, has a full-fledged Institutional Ethical Review Board (IRB). All the research projects of the Institute or outside organisations having the Institute's faculty as research partners involving human subjects are reviewed and approved by the IIPS-IRB. The committee ensures that research involving humans is conducted according to the legal, institutional and professional ethical guidelines, focusing on privacy, confidentiality, voluntary participation and human subject protection. IRB at the Institute is following similar rules and regulations as suggested by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR).

IIPS-IRB is chaired by an external expert and members from different disciplines, like medical sciences, legal experts, social activists, community representatives and representatives of non-government organisations.

outreach activities. The purpose of these programs was to inform the local community about



the signs and symptoms of tuberculosis, the ways in which it is spread, the treatments that are available, and the significance of reducing stigma. The volunteers and peer educators were instrumental in spreading these ideas on campus and in the local communities.

Around 100 members from students, staff, and faculty participated in taking the pledge and attended the TB awareness lecture delivered by Dr. Manasi Palav. The IIPS marathon saw enthusiastic participation from around 350 individuals, reflecting strong community involvement and commitment to TB awareness.



IIPS organized health camps and screening drives in conjunction with the local district TB officers and staff. To encourage people to get screened for TB symptoms, a screening camp was set up outside the campus. A qualified medical staff was on hand to help with the screening process. People who had more than three symptoms were directed to the local government hospital. Around 115 persons were screened in this campaign.

Skits were performed at IIPS by students, staff, and faculty to create awareness and impart knowledge in an entertaining manner. As a part of the outreach activity, the skits, along with interactive discussions and screening for TB symptoms, were organised at the Ganga-Jamna Coop. housing society premises,



Nerul. About 150 residents near the outreach activity area participated in the skit show and joined interactive discussions after the skit performance.



The TB campaign concluded with a closing ceremony on 27th March 2025, where the winners of the poster and slogan competitions were awarded prizes, and all the volunteers involved in the activity were felicitated for their contributions. IIPS's active participation in the TB awareness program not only enhanced community engagement and

outreach efforts but also fostered a spirit of leadership and social responsibility among its students.
