## **About the Seminar**

The International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS) is pleased to announce its national seminar with the theme, "Tracking progress of Sustainable Development Goals with a focus on Uttar Pradesh." in collaboration with Department of Statistics, Banaras Hindu University (BHU). Envisioned in 2015, the sustainable development goals (SDGs) list a set of 17 interconnected goals in a wide range of social, economic, and environmental spectrum. In India, the SDGs indicators have been integrated in national and state planning framework. However, the progress in achieving the SDGs is largely uneven across the states and socio-economic groups. Demographic changes in Northern States of India may act as catalyst in realising the SDGs. The primary objective of this national seminar is to deliberate on India's progress in realizing the SDGs with a special emphasis on Uttar Pradesh.

Uttar Pradesh, India's most populous state in India, accounting for nearly 16 percent of country's population, has been undergoing fast demographic transition. The state is characterised by large variation in fertility and mortality level across districts and sub-population. The state is also experiencing fast economic growth and reduction in multidimensional poverty. These demographic and economic changes may accelerate in the journey of Uttar Pradesh towards achieving the SDGs. Its contribution in India's population may reflect the state's commitment to population, development and inclusive growth. To ensure that no one is left behind, the state needs to remain dedicated to address the complex challenges it faces on the path to sustainable development.

This national seminar offers a valuable platform to academia, researchers, development sector professionals and policy makers. It will serve as an ideal forum for these diverse stakeholders to engage in meaningful dialogues and deliberations regarding the future trajectory of Uttar Pradesh's development. The collaborative efforts can address the state's unique challenges and harness its potential for inclusive and sustainable development.

#### Instructions for Submitting Abstracts

Faculty, research scholars and professionals are invited to submit online abstract of 300 words and an extended abstract of 2-3 pages on or before 31st December 2023 (the submission link is <u>https://www.iipsindia.ac.in/content/iips-annual-seminar</u>) In case of any difficulty in online submission, you may contact the organizers by email at <u>iipsseminar2024@iipsindia.ac.in</u>. Abstracts must contain objectives, data and methods, and the findings, along with name(s) of author(s), designation, affiliations/university/institute, and email id.

## **Awards for Best Posters**

There will be two poster sessions with about 30 posters each. The poster evaluation committee will select the three best posters for the awards. The presenting author of the best poster will be awarded Rs.7,500/-, the second-best poster will receive Rs. 5,500/-, and the third-best poster will receive Rs.3,500/-. The receipt of awards is subject to the attendance of the poster presenting author on all three days of the seminar.

### **Financial and Local Support**

Accommodation will be provided to the participants. Travel expenses and local hospitality of one presenting author of each accepted paper traveling from any place in India will be reimbursed up to AC-III tier train fare (not premium) or equivalent bus fare via shortest route. However, participants are also encouraged to explore their own source of financial support to meet travel expenses and registration fee. Travel grant is subject to the submission of full paper on or before the deadline mentioned. Foreign participants have to arrange their travel expenses and accommodation.

#### How to Reach Department of Statistics, BHU

Banaras Hindu University is around 9 km from Varanasi Railway Junction, Varanasi and approximately 30 km from Lal Bahadur Shastri International Airport, Varanasi. The Department of Statistics is 2.5 km from the main gate of Banaras Hindu University. From BHU main gate, one can get hand rickshaw, auto rickshaw, and toto (E-Ricksaw) to reach the department of statistics.
