Report– Extempore on different initiatives being undertaken through NEP 2020

An extempore competition was conducted on **30th September 2025**, from **5:00 P.M. to 5:30 P.M.**, in the **MSD Classroom, 2nd Floor, Library Building, IIPS**. Organized as part of the **NEP SAARTHI initiative**, the event engaged **first-year Master’s and Ph.D. students** in an insightful discussion on various initiatives being implemented under the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**.

Prof. D. A. Nagdeve, Director & Senior Professor (Additional Charge), IIPS, inaugurated the event. **Dr. Kunal Keshri**, NEP SAARTHI Coordinator, highlighted the key initiatives of NEP 2020.

Twelve students participated in the competition - **eight under male and four under female category** in the extempore. Each participant was allotted **three minutes** to speak. 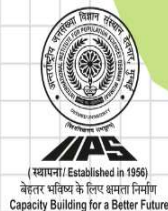

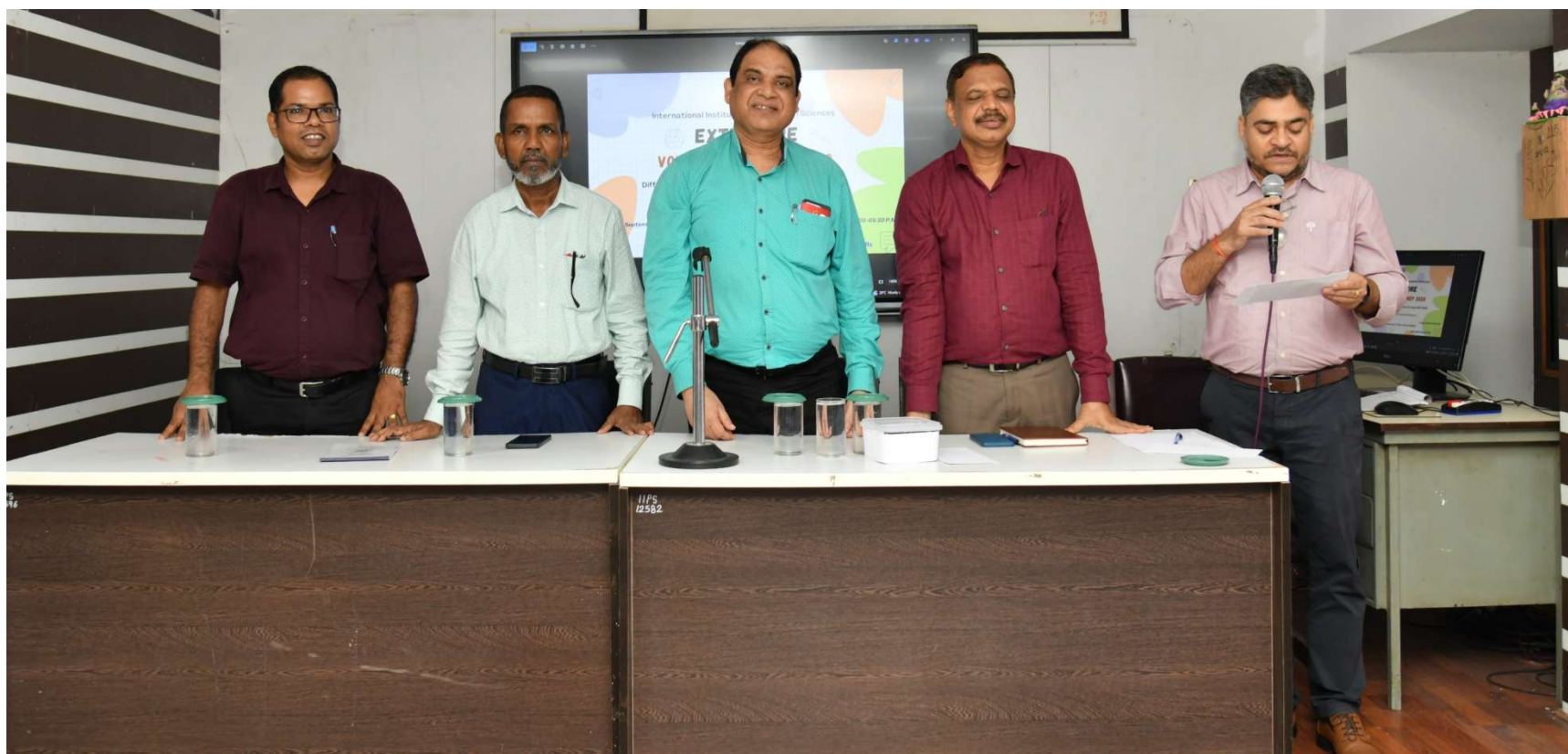

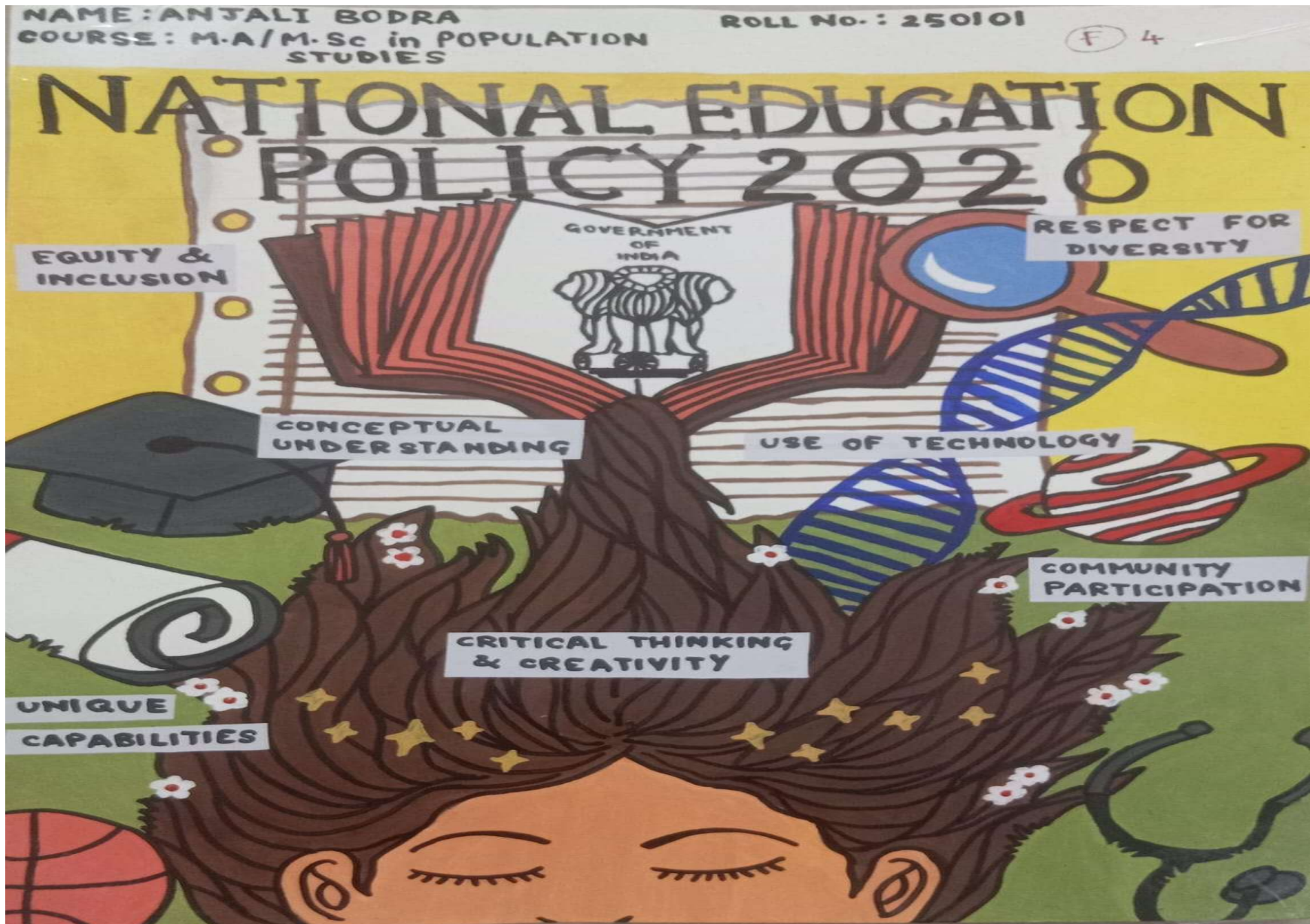
