Public Lecture on

The Garment Industry in Bangladesh Under COVID-19: Lessons from the Rana Plaza Disaster on How we Understand Worker Safety



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The COVID-19 pandemic has shaken the world's economy and supply chains worldwide. The ready-made garment (RMG) sector in Bangladesh has been especially hard hit as consumer demand for apparel has plummeted, leading to global retailers cancelling orders and revising their sourcing strategies. To situate what is currently happening to the industry under this global pandemic, the lecture will draw some lessons from an earlier crisis in Bangladesh - from one of the worst industrial disasters in history, the collapse of the Rana Plaza building in 2013. In this presentation, the speaker will focus specifically on the distorted notions of what constitutes safety for workers, primarily for women workers, which continue to perpetuate the cycle of labor violations for those at the very bottom of global supply chain. The talk will draw on evidence from a survey with BRAC University, Bangladesh where we interviewed 1,057 garment workers to understand how the pandemic had impacted their lives (Rabbani, A, Saxena, SB & Islam, MF, 2020).
